OFFICERS' MEETING MINUTES

OFFICERS' MEETING—January 6, 2021

Meeting held on the Zoom Platform

14 members participated: 13 Baronage/ officers/deputies; 1 members of the populace

The calendar for 2021 is being filled with rescheduled events. Once the suspension is lifted 1 1/2 years of events have been planned and jammed into one year. Potentially Winter War Maneuvers could be in September, with Gulf having been rescheduled for October. Locally the Medieval Olympics Challenge will be a Yule log in any media to be presented at the January populace meeting.

The name proposal Tove Briandohter is at Kingdom for consideration. Arts and Sciences classes are being scheduled. One Wednesday will be scheduled for members to show what they are working on or have done. Using social media and talking to non-SCA members about our organization are future subjects. Once in person can resume hands on class series on from start to finish are proposed; i.e. from sheep to shawl. ZOOM contacts for classes and other gatherings/meetings will be posted on the web site and our other social media. The email address for the Dragonfly on line was shut down December 15th. A new mailing system is being researched.

The Exchequer reported a balance of \$16,440.86. The fourth quarter and Domesday reports will be done once the December bank statement received. The budget for 2021 was approved by the finance committee. With the current situation no expenditures, even those budgeted, will be made without prior approval. A new location for the Baronial property is needed. A possible location has been found if the current location can be used through the rest of the month. Officers are to get their inventories of Baronial property in their possession in. It is required for year end reports.

All martial activities are still suspended. Archery will possibly resume if Covid numbers and weather allow. Even if the weather does not support doing archery, thrown weapons or arrow repair could be done.

Vatavia's bid for our Coronation rotation goes in this month. It is not known at this time what Their Majesties plans for Crown and Coronation will be once the suspension is lifted. The fourth quarter reports are due with courtesy copies to the Seneschal and Baronage. The Chronicler's office is a required position for a Barony. Interested individuals should contact the Seneschal. The office is required to put out a publication each quarter.

The meeting adjourned.

OFFICERS' MEETING—February 3, 2021

Meeting held on the Zoom Platform

11 members participated: 10 Baronage/ officers/deputies/ champions; 1 members of the populace

This month's Medieval Olympic challenge is to produce a backdrop. These are to be presented at this month's populace meeting. Possible future challenges are for groups to produce a newcomer project or display and trebuchets have been requested. In January the Yule log challenge items were presented.

Plans are being made for the Fall Renaissance Festival to increase visibility with signage and dressing up the Dell area. Ideas from Master Vincent de Vere's presentation on recruiting and retention are being developed.

There are two Vatavian proposals in process, one at Kingdom and one at national. Classes are planned for February and March for arts and sciences. This month is embroidery. Then a guest teacher in An Tir will present on Roman garb. Additionally the last Wednesday of the month is the Maker Meet Up which is for any subject discussion and an additional opportunity to get together, an additional populace.

The Web Minister is working on resolving host issues on different pages of the Baronial site. Members not on social media are requested to get addresses in to be included on posting and Newsblasts. Members are asked to let those not on social media know. Also members are encouraged to continue to reach out and communicate with other members.

The Exchequer reported that the Domesday report for last year has been turned in. The current balance is \$16,437.86. Members are not to make any expenditures without first checking with the Exchequer. Once a new Chronicler is selected publishing software will be obtained.

Martial activities continue on hold with the suspension until June. Archery activities awaits suitable weather.

Their Excellencies added that member Sir Stephen Norfolk has been seriously ill but is better and is in good spirits. The best method for contacting him will be discussed with his family and members informed.

The deadline for applications for the position of chronicler is February 12th to allow time to become familiar with the publishing before the first quarter publishing deadline.

OFFICERS' MEETING—March 3, 2021

Meeting held on the Zoom Platform

12 members participated: 10 Baronage/ officers/ deputies/champions; 2 members of the populace

Vatavia will be hosting Winter War Maneuvers here February 19, 2022. The bid for Winter Coronation 2022 has been turned in but no notification has been received whether it has been accepted.

We will **not** be participating **officially** in the Spring Renaissance Festival here. Members are welcome to participate and volunteer **only** as private citizens. We are planning to be part of the Fall Festival. The Medieval Olympic Challenge for March is for local groups to produce a newcomer/ recruitment display. Containers are being built for this. The April Challenge is planned to be trebuchets.

The new Chronicler, Ly Heidi Anne Draper, was announced. Her deputy is Matthias of Worcestershire. She reminded members that all submissions, other than officer letters, need signed permission to publish. One Vatavia proposal has gone onto national for registration, Eyfriðr's badge, and will be decided in June. The Arts and Sciences Minister has arranged for a class on Roman garb. April 14th she will demo making glass beads. The monthly Maker Meet Up discussion provided some class ideas. She also encourages members to attend online presentations from outside our local group. The Castellan has reached out to past interested individuals to provide current contact and activity information... The Web Minister is continuing to update the site content and resolve problems with the award form and Census.

The Exchequer reported a balance of \$16,434,86. A finance meeting was held after the Officers' meeting. With the return of warmer weather work on Baronial property and projects will start in preparation for the resumption of events and the Fall Renaissance Festival. Space has been offered by Their Excellencies at their residence.

Both the Cut and Thrust and Heavy Combat Marshals had no practices. It was proposed that a date be set for a meeting at an outdoor location for both fighting groups to get their gear out and prepare for the resumption of practices and events. Gear can be inspected for wear and needed repairs.

The Archer Marshal tentatively plans to resume practice on March 14th weather and Covid numbers cooperating. The practice will be masked

with social distancing. It is planned to have thrown weapons as well as a pell for fighters to practice and tables for arts and sciences work and projects. The practices will alternate between Hutchinson at Their Excellencies and Andover at Ulf's and Alia's.

There are several officers looking for deputies. It was noted that some are holding more than one office. Once the suspensions are eased these individuals will have more to do. Specifically needing a deputy are Seneschal, Exchequer, Archer Marshal, Web Minister, Arts and Sciences. There are others who could also use the assistance. Any interested individual should contact the officer. If a member knows of someone whho might be interested please let the Seneschal or Their Excellencies know.

There being no other business the meeting adjourned.



Catapults

and

7rebuchets

Crusaders brought knowledge of siege weapons back with them to Europe in the 1100's. However, such weapons had existed for centuries. The Roman Empire in the 3rd-4th century BCE had ballistas, developed from bows, and catapults. These used torsion from twisted materials to produce the throwing power. These used the stored potential energy in a sudden release. The violent stopping of the throwing arm of the catapult absorbed much of this energy. These weapons had the advantage of smaller, lighter size. They could be dismantled, transported and reassembled at the site. The disadvantage was the constant required maintenance. They often failed, could not be effectively aimed, had a straight trajectory and limited range. It required a good size firing team to operate the catapult.

Trebuchets came much later to Europe. The power source was traction produced by teams of men or a counterweight, instead of torsion. This type of weapon was simpler in design, more durable, and required fewer operators. Using the advantage of a longer lever, high elevation and a sling for the projectile produced considerable acceleration from the effects of gravity and the rotation of the lever producing an arcing trajectory. They provided greater range and heavier payloads. However they required more time to reload –only 3 to 4 shots a day, more time to construct and could not be transported. Building on site was common. Physics shows these need careful calibration for the correct counterweight (as much as 40 times the projectile weight), angle of release, and distance to target. To throw a 250 pound stone 600 feet would require a counterweight of 5-6 tons.

Trebuchets were first used in China in the 4th century BCE. The design was carried west into the Middle East by the Avars, Eur-Asian nomads, in the 6th century CE. These machines are recorded as being used in Byzantium in 587 CE, Islam 624 CE, by the Franks, Saxons and Russians in the 7th century CE, Scandinavia 873 CE. The first types used traction with teams of men pulling on the short end of the lever. A disadvantage was coordination of the pulling teams which was a challenge. A hybrid style came along that put weight directly on the shorter end of the trebuchet's lever allowing gravity to do the work. A 1187 military manual written by one of Saladin's engineers stated a hybrid trebuchet had the equivalent power of a 500 man team. The first solid reference to a counterpoise/counterweight trebuchet is its use in 1199 at the siege of Castelnuavo Bocca d'Adda in Lombardy.

The name trebuchet is from the Middle French trebuch meaning to tumble, fall over. Several other names were given to these weapons. During the siege of 579 Archbishop John of Thessalonikes (Macedonia) called them petrobolos, city takers. In the 11th century in the Middle East it was referred to as al-Ghadban, the furious one. Several Italian nicknames are God's stone thrower, daughter of the earthquake, big mother and bad neighbor. The first English reference to a trebuchet was in the 14th century with the name trepegete. Perhaps the most famous named trebuchet is Lupus Guerre, the War Wolf.

It was built for the siege of Sterling Castle, April 22- July 24, 1304, for Edward I, the Hammer of the Scots. Little information exists about this trebuchet. There are no representations of it. It is believed to have been the largest weapon of its kind ever built. It was built on site with the materials being transported to the castle. What is known is that it took 30 wagons to haul the materials. The chief engineer, James of St. George, worked with 5 master carpenters, directing 49 workers for 3 months. It was the last weapon constructed. There were 12 to 17 (depending on the reference) other siege weapons used. They also had names; but, the name Loup de Guerre, or Ludgar as the Anglo-Saxon members called it, is the name that has come down through history.

There are references by chroniclers who were there about the siege and battles. But there are only two court records that actually mention the War Wolf by name: (translated from the Latin)

"To Master Alexandro le Convers, for money paid by him to the carpenters making the engine called Lupus Guerre, and other workers working in May and June 1304 10 shillings on 7 June 1304"

"To Thomas de Viridis Campus, the queen's valet, recompensed at the King's hand for his labors in the making of the Lupus Guerre, which the King ordered to be made to slight Stirling Castle £ 40"

And a third reference, but not mentioning the name: "...to Reginald the janitor for quarding its beams for 40 nights in June and July 1304"

The surrender of the Scots was denied on July 20th. Edward wanted to see the engine in action. When the garrison was allowed to surrender July 24th 30 defenders had survived. Witnesses wrote that the War Wolf demolished an entire section of the castle wall.

It is estimated the War Wolf stood 300 feet or more tall when the throwing arm was extended. It is believed that it threw the projectile about 200 yards at a speed of 120 mph. But by 1400's the development of cannons and the increased use of gunpowder replaced the old siege engines. Smaller trebuchets still operated, but as troop support. Large trebuchets were still used when gunpowder was in short supply, which is the reason Hernando Cortéz built one for the attack on Tenochtitlán. Unfortunately a miscalculation had the first projectile land on the trebuchet destroying it.

Trebuchets have not totally disappeared from history. During the Great Siege of Gibraltar, June 24, 1779 to February 7, 1783 (the longest continuous siege in history) trebuchets replaced some of the cannons. They had greater distance and could reach the enemy ships and island locations that the cannons could not. Even recently small engines have been used by rioters in Kiev in 2012 and the Ukraine in 2014. They were used during the Battle of Aleppo in the Syrian Civil War in 2013. An ancient weapon that still has found uses in our current Middle Ages and the world.


