

OFFICERS' MEETING MINUTES

OFFICERS' MEETING—October 6, 2021

Studio School, 751 George Washington Boulevard, Wichita Ks, 67211

13 members were present: 8 Baronage/ officers/ deputies; 4 members of the populace; 1 child

Project work days for Winter War Maneuvers will be scheduled. The deadline for bids for Valor XLI has passed. The financial committee will meet to consider the for approval the bid received.

Due to fee changes a new location to hold Midwinter Merriment. A planning committee being formed for this local event is looking for volunteers. After December 31 a new weekly meeting site will also be needed.

This year's Renaissance Festival set attendance and pop sales. Work on projects for the next Festival will continue. It was discussed. Based on the new Boo at the Zoo format Vataivia will not be volunteering. Her Excellency Genèvieve will be contacting Barnes and Noble about scheduling gift wrapping. No special themes will be scheduled with Exploration Place until after January 1, 2022. It will be requested to resume fighter practice at EP January 2, 2022 through mid-March.

There is one heraldic name proposal in process; another was just sent in. The 4th quarter *Dragonflyre* will have the theme of what was done or what we do in dormant winter. Deadline for submissions is December 15th. The Chatelaine report has been sent in. It is estimated we reached about 6250 people. The upcoming arts and sciences classes were announced: October 13th Frithuswith on period embroidery stitches; November 10th fabric stamping with a workday for backdrops the 17th and additional days to be scheduled; February 23 Matthias teaching knots with a workday for tent ropes; March 9th Matthias Coptic book binding.

Social Media is working on getting the Kingdom guidelines from the web link. The Web Minister is working on changing the look of the web site.

The current bank statement shows a balance of \$16,426.34 with two checks outstanding. The gratuity from the Renaissance Festival still needs to be deposited. It is planned to do the new bank card to coincide with local and Kingdom office changes beginning 2022. With the new bank merger at the same time account options and new checks will be considered. Although the bank would prefer all electronic procedures. However hard copy statements are required. A finance committee separate from the Officers' date will be scheduled to go over the Valor bid. Budget requirements for 2022 from each officer need to be sent to the Exchequer by November 1 to facilitate producing the 2022 budget.

Archery practice at OJ Watson Park will end October 30th when the Park goes to winter hours. It has not been decided if the previous winter schedule at alternate locations in Hutchinson and Andover will be held. The Archer Marshal is looking for a crossbow pattern to have sessions for those wishing to make one. Also a class on arrow making is possible. The Knight Marshal plans to check about moving practice to the front of the Park for November, when weather permits. It there are spear authorizations at Toys for Tots Joachim will have spears available there for people to use.

Award recommendations are needed by both the Baronage and Their Majesties. For Kingdom award recs it was suggested to add when and what events the individual will attend. Quarterly reports are due the end of next week. Officers were reminded to send the appropriate copies to the Seneschal and Baronage.

The Board of Directors directive to require proof of vaccination is controversial. Their Majesties, Their Highnesses and the Witan will make the decision at Crown Tournament on this. There have already been meetings with the Baronages and Seneschals to discuss this. The Kingdom Seneschal has asked for feedback from the populace.

The passing of member Andreas ap David from complications of COVID was announced.

The meeting adjourned.

Studio School 751 George Washington Boulevard, Wichita Ks, 67211

18 members were present: 10 Baronage/ officers/ deputies; 5 members of the populace [two left before the meeting began]

Toys for Tots November 20th in Jefferson City, Missouri will have the first spear authorizations for Cut and Thrust and its first archery competition. Participation in competitions and tournaments at this event have a donation fee of a new toy of a minimum \$5 value. Kris Kinder is December 11th in the Kansas City area. This is the same day as the Investiture for the Principality of Vindheim in Oklahoma. Winter Coronation is scheduled for January 8, 2022 in Lonely Tower, Omaha, Nebraska. With Winter War Maneuvers here in Vatavia at the Farha Sports Complex on February 19, 2022. The event stewards are looking for a post revel site, crash space and a crash space coordinator.

A location is still being sought for our local Midwinter Merriment celebration. No demonstrations or presentations for other organizations are currently scheduled.

The arts and sciences classes and Sunday 'Stitch and Kvetch' have been well attended. Classes currently scheduled are November 10th fabric printing, December 8th making felt dolls, February 23rd Matthias teaching knots. January has open dates. Those interested in doing a class should contact the Arts and Sciences Minister. Caltrop staff reported the publication of Matthias's name and shield proposals on the Kingdom letter which will be decided on November 22nd. Konrad's name change will be decided at national in November with notification expected in January. The Web Minister asked members to look at the new web site. It was requested to let the Minister know if there was a problem with the new background. Work continues on finalizing the Gold Key and Minister of Youth inventories. The Hospitaller will deliver some of the brochures to the next fighter practice. The Seneschal has a donation of arts supplies for the MoY.

The Exchequer reported a balance of approximately \$16,423. Budget requests were due today; only two had been received. The Hospitaller stated he needs the figures from the recent printing for that office's request. It was noted that thee link to that information fails. There will be a finance meeting November 17th which is also the monthly populace meeting. The Valor 41 bid will be presented for approval. It was noted that the meeting is open for anyone interested. Due to the bank's computer being down details on the account under the new merger are still unanswered. The signature card will not be done until January to coincide with the change of the Kingdom Exchequer. It was announced that the gratuity from the Museum of World Treasures should be received in two weeks.

Fighter practice will be starting at noon when it is warmer and now at the front of OJ Watson Park. A 45° temperature cut off will be in effect. Cancellations will be decided and posted 2 hours before the scheduled practice. The fighters and Marshals will discuss and decide the start date and time in January for indoor practice at Exploration Place.

Archery will start doing classes in the winter months on construction for arrows, bolts, bow strings and two types of crossbows, hand and full size. Metal prods are recommended as more durable than fiber glass. The classes will also facilitate repairs on the Baronial archery equipment. Individuals interested in stepping in to marshal archery activities when the current Archer Marshal is unavailable are being sought.

The Kingdom bid for Masters of the Duel is open till the end of November. It was approved that if no bid is received from another group that Joachim will produce a bid for Vatavia to host the event. Vatavia's required bid to host the Spring Crown Tournament April 2023 is due April 2022.

The local calendar will be updated with the new schedule dates and times. The Arts and Sciences Minister reminded members to do award recommendations. Her Excellency announced she had three boxes of garb donated from Bois d'Arc for the populace of Vatavia. The Property Master has projects lined up to repair, rebuild, and paint Baronial property in time for the Spring Renaissance Festival April 9th-10th, 2022. With the success of the pop booth this last Fall, two are planned for Spring.

The Seneschal asked officers and their deputies to consider a goal for the coming year beyond what they usually do for their office. What is the one thing that each would like to accomplish in the coming year.

There being no other business the meeting adjourned.

There will be no Vatavia meetings Wednesday December 22nd or Sunday December 26th. December 29th is the last meeting at the Studio School. A new weekly meeting site is still being considered and locations looked at. Their Excelencies and the Seneschal ask the populace to inform them about their ideas on this. They also ask how many month is an indoor location needed. Over the history of the Barony a variety of different ways have been done to answer the needs of the Barony. It was suggested to do some form of online survey.

Winter War Maneuvers are in Vatavia February 19th at the Farha Soccer field at the South YMCA off Meridian. The flier and website are up. It has been asked that members preregister. The venue does not allow outside food to be brought in. Attendees are encouraged to bring their own chairs. Crash space locations are needed. Robert the Scot is the contact person who will be coordinating crash space needs. A Royal Liaison is needed. Sign up sheets for various jobs will be posted.

Midwinter Merriment found a site, the Congregational Church, 2909 NE 29th Street N just off Webb Rd. The event will be January 22nd from 10am-4pm. A pot luck will be done with the Baronage providing the meat. Serving will be done as a serving line following current SCA food service guidelines. There will be a \$5 per person site fee. Sign up sheets will be available in the near future.

There are currently there are five heraldic proposals in process at Kingdom and National/Laurel. Practice will move to the indoor location at Exploration Place in January. The location in the building might change January $2^{\rm nd}$ depending on the transition between exhibits. It was announced that His Excellency Lawrence authorized in cut and thrust spear at Toys for Tots.

The Archer Marshall is still looking for a deputy to run activities when she is not able to be there. Arrow making and cross bow making classes are being planned. The possibility of Zooming those classes was suggested.

The Seneschal covered the COVID Safe Policy for attending any activities. Before even signing the attendee contact sheet members must show proof of vaccination or a negative COVID test no more than three days before the activity. Electronic proof is acceptable. Individuals doing the checking must verify that they personally have seen every person's documentation. If the person doing the checking must leave or another person takes over an entirely new 'sign in/tracking' sheet must be done.

The Seneschal requested that all officers and deputies that have not done so to send him their personal office goals for the coming year. Having our goals will help him plan his goals.

The Crown bid from Vatavia for 2023 will be due at Kingdom April 2022. their Excellencies would like proposals in by 15th of February 2022 for consideration.

The meeting adjourned.

FINANCE MEETING— November 17, 2021

Committee members present were Kris Griffith-Bumgardner/ HE Genèvieve de Chambéry; Dr. Larry Bumgardner/ HE Lawrence Taillefer the Leech, Robert Botkin/ Ld. Robert the Scott; Kurt Jones/ Ld. Konrad von Roth; Kevin Larsen/ Úlfr Halfdane incoming treasurer; Mary J. Day/ HE Marie and Aimme Moisa/ Ly. Alia Martialis representing the populace. Also in attendance were 9 other members.

The meeting was to finalize the budget for 2022. It has been pended to the December Officers' meeting to finish obtaining the possible locations and costs of a weekly meeting site. No budget recommendation for a weekly site could be made at this time.

Changes were made to reduce Spring and Fall Ren fairs to \$100 each; reduce Arts and Sciences to \$100; add the Castellan's budget of \$200; increase the Web Minister by \$200, for software, to \$310; add to Baronial property \$75 for reflective paint for signs. All other line items were either unchanged or had no budget requested for the coming year. A budget line item was added for the office of the Minister of Youth which had not been filled for several years.

Kingdom recommended guidelines are to maintain 2 years of regular annual budget. The current budget of \$8485 exceeds half of the current bank balance. Different fund raising options were suggested. Minimal fees for local activities was discussed. The procedure for arts and sciences classes was covered. Instructors are responsible for supplies, to be compensated directly to the instructor through a class fee for said materials. With little income from the last year due to COVID restrictions things need to be run tighter, financially, in the coming year. The conundrum of including a tithe in the budget was raised in the discussion on events.

It was approved for this budget year to order new checks with the current, correct bank information for \$65.

The event bid for Valor 41 was presented. Since the event has had to be canceled and rescheduled twice some expenditures may change. It is being negotiated to have the original site rental not raised from \$2000 to \$2500. Sanitation expense may change from the 2021 price quote. The order will be made after January 1st. Feast is planned to be done under the current procedural guidelines covering the serving of food. The tentative Valor bid was accepted.

There being no other business the meeting adjourned.

Current correct bank checks have been obtained. It was on this year's budget. Current correct deposit have been ordered and received. The cost was

The meeting finalized the budget for 2022. It had been pended from the December Officers' meeting to finish obtaining the possible locations and cost for a weekly meeting site. Line items changed were Valor increased from \$5000 to \$5500 to reflect the addition of feast. The feast fee will be increased from the previous year's \$10; approved. The Yule budget site fee was changed to the actual expense of \$200 from the estimated \$150; approved. It was noted that this expense will be off set by the \$5 event fee. The MoY budget amount has been received. \$60 was approved. A ll other line items were either unchanged or had no budget requested for the coming year.

Three options for a weekly Wednesday site location were discussed. The current Studio School contract has been offered at an increase from \$140 a month to \$170 a month for a total of \$2040 a year. This was not accepted. A one year only, anonymous donation to remain at the Studio School with 2 weeks in the room and 2 weeks in the gym was not accepted. A more sustainable option would be beneficial. The Congregational Church 2909 NE 29th St. N- the site of Midwinter Merriment- would cost \$20 to \$25 a week. At 48 weeks used a year that would be \$960 to \$1200 a year if all 48 weeks are used. It was was moved, seconded to accept this option.

The motion passed.

Kingdom recommended guidelines are for half of available funds. The current budget authority would be \$8605, half of the current bank balance. The total of all approved line items is \$10,355. It was noted that there would be funds from the Midwinter Merriment site fee charge. Valor can be expected to, at minimum, cover costs and usually shows some profit. Our guaranteed pop booth gratuity from the Great Plains Renaissance Festival is \$1000 a year, \$500/ festival. It was suggested that this arrangement needs to be a written contract. It was suggested also to do a projected income as part of future annual budgets. It was moved and seconded to accept the 2022 budget of \$10,355. The motion was approved.

An updated Financial Policy and Committee guidelines will be sent to committee members and published.

There being no other business the meeting adjourned.

Covid Guidelines

We know that the current rules for events and gatherings are changing frequently, so wanted to provide some clarity with where our current Kingdom rules differ from the BoD minimum requirements. This list will also be uploaded as a PDF to the files section if you would like to have a copy available at events or meetings for any reason. If you have questions feel free to ask—Our email is always open, but please apply these in the spirit of safety in which they are intended, refrain from Rules lawyering, and DON'T BE THE REASON WE HAVE TO MAKE ANOTHER RULE.

Current Rules for Calontir Event Attendance (as of 8/5/21)

- •These rules apply to both events and local meetings, practices, and gatherings.
- •These rules are in addition to, not in place of, the Society level rules from the BoD.
- •These rules are the MINIMUM requirements, and local group leadership may enact more stringent requirements if the local health conditions warrant.
- •All Local, State, and Federal Guidelines are to be followed, including masking and gathering size limits.
- •All attendees to any event, meeting, or practice, must be signed in on a roster including current accurate contact information.
- •If you are fully vaccinated and it has been long enough that the vaccine will have reached maximum efficacy, you may choose not to wear a mask while outdoors.
- •Everyone must mask indoors, regardless of vaccination status.
- •Masks must be worn covering the nose and mouth.
- •You may bring your own food to an event and you may share it with others.
- •Food may be served in an official capacity, such as an inn or vigil table, with the following requirements:o Anyone making or handling food must be masked and glovedo Anyone serving food or in the preparation or serving areas but not actually handling food must be masked.
- •If you would usually be required to be masked, you must distance a minimum of 6 feet to unmask for eating or drinking.o Vaccinated members of the populace may be closer than 6 feet outdoors, but must still distance to eat or drink indoors.o Unvaccinated members of the populace must distance at least 6 feet to eat or drink both indoors and out.
- •Feasts will not be allowed at this time.
- •Water Bearing may be provided from the communal coolers, but only into personal containers, not our traditional shared jugs.

The Tradition of the Wren

Today's conglomerate of many beliefs and traditions came from several sources. From the start the early Christian Church assimilated pagan practices and symbols. The policy was to save those deeply loved, innocent parts and transform them to something significant with a Catholic context. Pope Gregory the Great encouraged Augustine of Canterbury in this in the seventh century.

Even before this, the birth of Christ had been ritualized as an aid to the growth of the relatively young church. In the fourth century the church, some sources credit Pope Julius I (337-352), had selected December 25th as the date for celebrating the birth of Christ. This coincided with the winter solstice observances, the festival of the unconquered sun, the birth of the Persian Mithras, and the Egyptian Horus, the festival for the Phrygian god Attis, the Roman Saturnalia, The Norse Yuletide, and Jewish Hanukkah.

Christianity was brought to Ireland in the late fifth century. Local beliefs were incorporated there as elsewhere. The Venerable Bede wrote that the 25th was the Celtic Mothers' Night, the beginning of the year. It also became the Christian celebration of the Nativity.

Fires and lights were part of the culture's winter solstice observances. The Yule log was part of the Celtic tradition as it was with the Teutonic people. Scandia and Ireland also had Yule candles. The Christian church equated the candles' symbols of victory over darkness and enlightenment as Jesus Christ, the light of the world. The Yule candle was lit Christmas day and burned until Twelfth Night. Some sources held that it burned from sunset until sunrise; others that it was continuously burned. It was not to be touched after lit. To do so would bring bad luck. Only the head of household or someone named Mary was to extinguish the flame. In later period candles were placed in Irish windows as a sign of welcome for Joseph and Mary. Later, during the Reformation, these became signs for the priests of safe havens; yet, easily explained away as old superstitions to others.

Saturnalia was a Roman holiday season which in part was celebrated with gift giving, garlands, incense, candles, and sometimes birds were common gifts. Older religions used birds as sacrifices, both real and symbolic. In Normandy wrens were caged. Called "poulette de Dieu" they were suppose to have brought moss and used this and their feathers for a coverlet for Jesus. The wren was also portrayed as a villain. A wren betrayed the hiding place of St. Stephen, the first Catholic martyr, to those hunting him. Therefore all wrens must do penance. Another tale relates how a wren pecking at the crumbs on a sleeping Dane's drum woke the boy and prevented the success of a sneak attack by the Irish.

All these mixed and blended together became the Irish tradition of hunting the wren., still practiced in some parts of Ireland. On St. Stephen's Day, December 26th, a wren was found, placed on a bed of evergreen, and taken around to others. The children asked for a treat or money either to celebrate the Saint's day or as a donation for others. This is also the English Boxing Day which traces back to Saturnalia activities, the collection by journeymen and apprentices of levies from their master's patrons, and Henry VIII Christmas boxes from his subjects.

These three Irish traditions of the season demonstrate the rich blending of beliefs, stories, symbols, customs and traditions that are to be found at this time of year for all cultures and beliefs.

Holiday Traditions

Today's combination of many beliefs and traditions for the winter holiday season come from several sources and cultures. The Venerable Bede wrote that the 25th was the Celtic Mothers' Night, the beginning of the year, which was also the Roman new year.

Fires and light were part of the many cultures' winter solstice observances. The Yule log was part of the Celtic tradition as it was with the Teutonic people. Scandinavia and Iceland also had Yule candles. The Christian church equated the candles' symbols of victory over darkness and enlightenment as Jesus Christ, the light of the world. The Yule candle was lit Christmas Day and burned until Twelfth Night, Epiphany. Some sources held that it burned from sunset until sunrise; others that it was burned continuously. It was not to be touched after lit. To do so would bring bad luck. Only the head of household or someone named Mary was to extinguish the flame. In later period the candles were placed in Irish windows as a sign of welcome for Joseph and Mary. Later, during the Reformation, these became signs for the priests of safe houses; yet, easily explained away as old superstitions to others.

Saturnali, December 17th- December 24th, was a Roman holiday season which in part was celebrated with gift giving. Garlands, incense, candles, and sometimes birds were common gifts. Older religions used birds as sacrifices, both real and symbolic. (Most of the gifts of the "Twelve Days of Christmas" carol are birds. The five golden rings being golden ring pheasants. A total of 184 birds!) St. Stephen's Day, December 26th, is known as Boxing Day in England. Apprentices and journeymen collected levies from their master's patrons. For Henry VIII of England this was when he received gift boxes from his subjects

In Normandy wrens were called "poulette de Dieu" since they were suppose to have brought moss and used this and their feathers for a coverlet for Jesus. Another tale relates how a wren pecking at the crumbs on a sleeping Dane's drum woke the boy and prevented the success of a sneak attack by the Irish. The wren was also portrayed as a villain. A wren betrayed the hiding place of St. Stephen, the first Catholic martyr, to those hunting him. Therefore all wrens must do penance. On St. Stephen's Day, December 26th, a wren was found, placed on a bed of evergreen, and taken around to others. The children would ask for a treat or money, either to celebrate the Saint's day or as a donation for others. (This is still done in parts of Ireland today.) December 21st, St. Thomas Day, was a time of Christmas begging also. In return for gifts beggars gave holly or mistletoe.

The Roman Kalends of January were the new year when houses were decorated with greenery and lights and presents were given to children and the poor. Teutonic people brought holly cuttings inside to provide refuge for sylvan sprites from the inclement weather. Evergreens were seen by many cultures as symbols of protection and continued life in the winter time. This was adopted by the Christian church. Altars were decorated with different greenery at this holiday time, except for mistletoe because of its association with the Druids. (Only one English cathedral was allowed to use this plant.) The use of greenery with Christmas is credited to St. Boniface who Christianize the Germans. He dedicated the fir tree to the Holy Child to replace Odin's oak.

All of these different cultures celebrated the lengthening day time with feasting. Wassail was part of German and Celtic Yule celebrations. Boiled puddings were part of England's celebrating. Spiced cakes or candies were special treats using the expensive, precious spices of the Orient. Fresh fruit in winter was a rare and expensive extravagance. More likely the fruit laden (infamous) fruitcake was served. The "Traditional" meal of today is actually a representation of many different cultures' cuisines. The American traditional meal uses, on the whole, foods 'discovered' in the Holy Land and New World.

These are the traditions of the season demonstrate the rich blending of all the different beliefs, stories, customs and traditions that are to be found at this time of year for all cultures and beliefs.

This recipe from Mistress Countess Elisabeth de Rossignol has been a regular Vatavian tavern item for over 20 years due to its popularity. This recipe is economical and easy to do. It fits in well as part of an historical feast or as a camping snack. This is a very user friendly recipe. Precise measurements are not mandatory nor critical.

Recipe submitted by HE Marie Chantel Delaire

Cheese Tarts (serves 40) 350 for time indicated on biscuits

13 oz. grated cheese (about 3.5 cups) 6 eggs
1 ½ cups milk ½ cup flour

1 cup cottage cheese ¼ tsp dill weed 4oz. sour cream sprinkle garlic powder

2 pkg refrigerator biscuits salt and pepper- to taste

Mix all ingredients together until smooth. (Ihave found doing the eggs and flour together first, till blended, easier. Then add the rest.)

Flatten $\frac{1}{2}$ of a refrigerator biscuit into each section of a muffin tin sprayed with PAM

(Bakers Joy works even better.)


Fill each muffin tin section about 2/3 full with batter.
