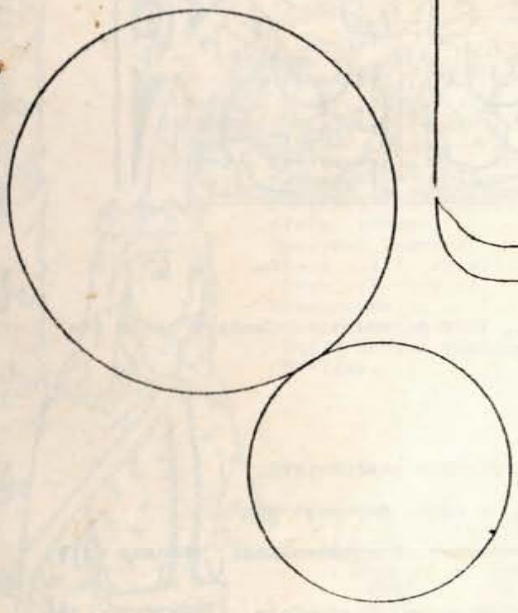

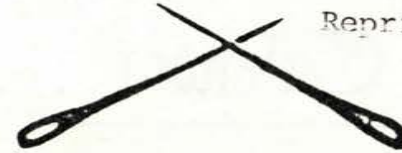
RIDDLE ME THIS.....

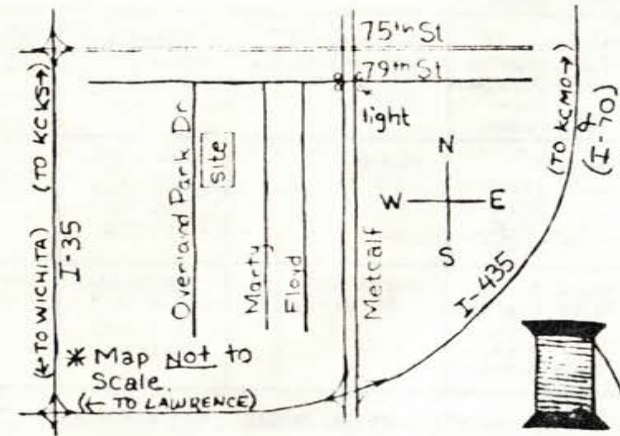

## EPISTLES FROM FREY

GABRIEL

Well, my friends:

Christmas-tide and Twelfth Night are now past, and the world once again is become mundane and grey with winter's cold. We can but await the coming spring (only 74 days 'til Easter). But at least in this most favored of lands, most of us have our well-gotten gains and Christmas tree plunder to warm our hearts 'til then.

The most avaricious of plunderers, a group of peoples whose greed changed the course of European history were the Danes, Norse and Swedes, known to most of us simply as "the Vikings." A Viking was not necessarily a blood-thirsty ravager. To go "a-viking" was to embark on a journey of gain, either by trade or by raiding. Which method was used depended upon the circumstances and which promised the greatest gain for the least risk. The vast empire of the Pus was built for more on trade than on conquest. Unfortunately, in Western Europe a great deal of wealth was placed in the hands of our brethren of the Church. Sworn to meek humility, not given to the war-like arts, often isolated from any hope of aid, they were perfect targets for viking raids.

The Viking, if he survived a trip (scurvy, the weather and defenders weapons claimed many), returned to his hearth with a great deal of plunder. On the Isle of Gotland, in the Baltic Sea, five hundred and twenty-five hoards of buried viking treasure have been uncovered. Buried treasure was valuable, became a warrior in Valhalla could retrieve his plunder for use in the netherworld but only if it remained undisturbed. One of the Gotland finds yielded 2,673 Arabic silver coins; another hoard consisted of 15 pounds of arm rings and silver ingots. If the idea of Arabic Coins in a Norse treasure surprizes you, consider this: a viking treasure hoard at Helgo, Sweden contained a bronze Buddha inlaid with silver from India.

Most Viking plunder was "hack-silver," captured armlets, bracelets, necklaces and other jewelry, some of it of fine workmanship, which were broken into smaller fragments for ease of transport. The Viking peoples had no interest in any non-Nordic art, and would rather melt down exquisite Byzantine or Arabic meshwork for boullion value, or for Nordic Craftsmen to work into Norse patterns. Indeed, Viking gold and silver-smiths achieved very high standards of skill and were capable of drawing silverwire to one-tenth of a millimeter for use in delicate cloisonne or striking 'rope' patterns.

Warm must have been the hearts of those Norse warriors after a successful Viking, for little is more warming to look upon than the reflected fire-glow on a golden chalice of mead, while beyond the fire-hall a northern winter rages.

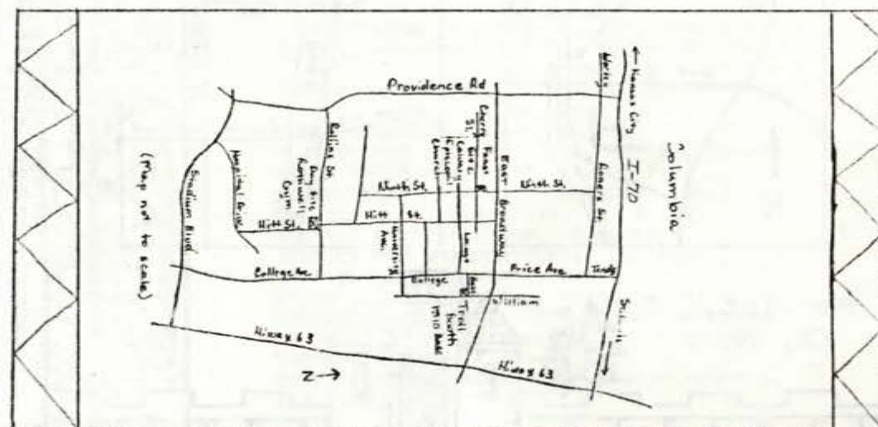

The Symposium will start at 10:00 a.m. and end sometime that evening. The building will stay open until midnight. Food is available several places within the building.

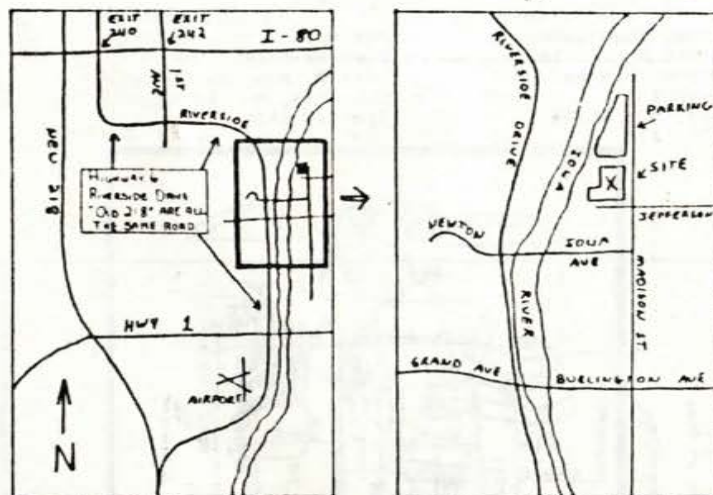
Tentative subjects include workshops for beginning and experienced scribes, left hand calligraphy, a business meeting and much time for exchange of ideas and information between scribes.

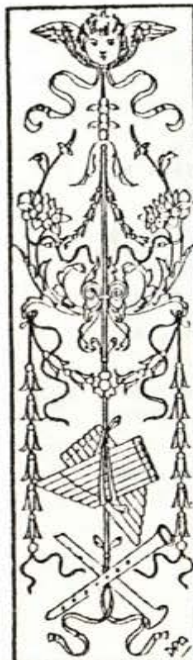
