Greetings. Affairs in the office of Arts & Sciences have been quiet over the last month with few V'tavians attending out-of town events, so there are no new victories to proclaim.

I must apologize to those who attempted to enter the Christmas Decoration event at the Christmas Court...there was simply too much to do in too little time.

It is my hope to initiate a summer-long V'tavian Arts and Sciences Marathon. Beginning on May 1, A.S. XXI, and ending with Valor VII, bring me your judging sheets on any competition within the scope of my office, and you will be credited with "points" assigned as follows: one point for every entry, two points for every entry receiving one-half or more of the potential judging points, three points for a victory, with a bonus point added for each entry which has not been judged before. First prize will be an all-expense paid trip for one to any Calontir event within one calendar year of Valor VII. This includes transportation to and from the event, either in the Baronial Fire Dragon or aboard the Smithy's luxurious "Limping Falcon" bus line, site and feast fees, and arrangement through the good offices of the Barony of V'tavia for crash space, and one other prize to be announced. Barony of Three Rivers March 15th, A.S. XX

Come one, come all to celebrate the Coronation of Prince Asgeirr and Princess Merriem as King and Queen (respectively) (and respectfully) of Calontir. This joyous festival will take place in the Barony of Three Rivers on the Ides of March, A.S. XX (1986). The day will begin with Coronation Court (so get there early!); it will also include the King's Champion tourney and arts and sciences displays, to which all are invited to contribute. The evening will feature a feast created by the incomparable Lord Nathan Adelaar, CIA.

Prince Asgeirr has decreed that the tournament to select his Champion shall follow a period precedent: it shall be "nasty, brutish, and short." To wit: it shall be a double elimination florentine holmgang (note: any two weapons, with only one hand per weapon at any time). Fighters who really don't want to be King's Champion are welcome to participate in the tourney too.

The sites for this will be a mixture of old and new. For the Coronation Court in the morning and the feast in the evening, we shall be using the First Congregational Church of Webster Groves, memorable from Changelings 1985 and other events. The tournament shall be at Second Presbyterian Church. (NOTE: Both sites are DRY!) Maps to the tourney site will be available at the feast/court site. Troll booth Friday night will be at Harald and Aleta's place. Crash space will be available by prior arrangement only.

The day will begin at 8:30, when the on-site troll will open. Coronation Court is scheduled to start at 10:00. After lunch, the tourney will begin at 1:30 (your armor will be inspected when you are first called to the field; if you are unsure whether your armor will pass, arrive early and talk to the marshal). Arts and sciences displays will be at the feast/court site from 1:00 to 4:00. Feast hall will open again at 6:00; the feast should be rolling by 6:30. Second Court of TRM Asgeirr and Merriem will be at 9:00 p.m.; the site will close at 11:00.

The fees for all this are as follows. Advance feast ticket reservations are \$8 each, and MUST BE POSTMARKED BY MARCH FIRST. Feast is limited to the first 200 paid reservations. Crash space requests should accompany reservations (mention smoking preferences and allergies). National members can send proof of membership (copy of membership card or newsletter mailing label) with your reservations and get a \$1 discount off your feast ticket. (Include one proof of membership for each ticket, of course.) Tickets will be \$9 at the door, or \$2 site fee for those not feasting. No discount for national members paying at the door; we don't want to deal with it. If you include a stamped postcard with your reservations, we'll send you a confirmation. 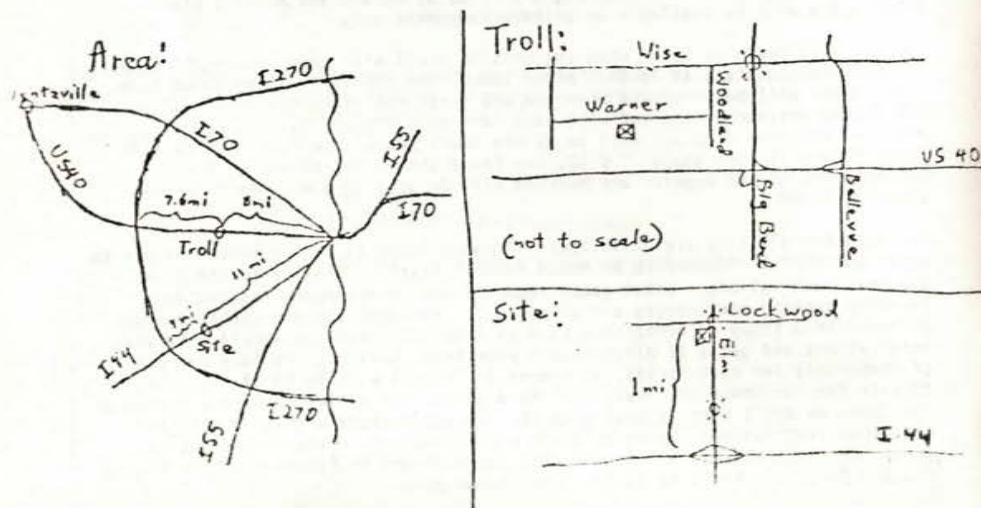

 Coming from north of I-70: take your favorite highway to I-270 southwest to US 40 east, and see below.
 Coming from west on I-70: take US 40 east at Wentzville, and see below.
 Coming from south of I-70: take your favorite highway to I-270 northwest to US 40 east, and see below.
 BELOW: Take US 40 7.6 miles east from I-270, and get off at the Bellevue exit. Turn left (north) on Bellevue and go to the first stop sign. Turn left (west) on Wise. About half a block past the first light, turn left (south) on Woodland. After another short block, turn right (west) on Warner and look for the SCA sign.
 Coming from the east: come in on I-55 or I-70. Coming across the Mississippi, stay on US 40 for 8 miles, and get off at the Big Bend North exit. At the first light, turn left (west) on Wise. After about half a block, turn left (south) on Woodland, and follow the directions above.

THE RHINE OF AN ANCIENT MARINER

OK, so he had treated my mother badly, as was the habit of his barbarous race. He was still my father and, though it was loathsome to think it, a part of him was born in me. So, when I felt I was ready, I decided to seek out my father in the land he called home, Germany. After all, I was a bard; and it is most important for one such as I to know the nature of things. I thought it right, then, that I should seek to know the land and people of my father. Thus begins the tale of my trip to Germany. In this first segment, I wish to describe my trip down that river that looms largest in the minds and hearts of its people - the Rhine; giver of life, famed in song and legend, Imperial Border, and Mother to Empires.

First some basics. The Rhine flows north 820 miles, starting in east central Switzerland and terminating at the North Sea after passing through The Netherlands. It forms the border between Germany and France through that section of the land known as Alsace-Lorraine. Among the major cities bordering the Rhine are: Basel, Strasbourg, Worms, Bonn (the present German capital), Cologne, Dusseldorf, and Rotterdam. It and the Danube formed the border of the ancient Roman Empire in the north. It was up the Rhine that the Frankish and Swabian Holy Roman emperors led their armies to defend, as well as frustrate, the Pope and people of Italy throughout the Middle Ages.

The Rhine is famous in song and legend, with the story of the Nibelungs, the Lorelei legend, the Mouse Tower Legend, and the Legend of the Heinzelmännchen or Goblins of Cologne. It is also justly famous today for its Rhine wines, of which I could tell you much if you catch me when I'm not drinking.

So much for the overview. Now here is what you really want to hear - Of Emperors and Castles.



The Rhine Emperors fall into three major houses or families: The Frankish, or Carolingian Emperors, headed by Charlemagne (Charles I); the Saxon house, headed by Otto I; and the Swabian or Hohenstauben Emperors, headed by Frederick I (Barbarossa). By "headed" I mean that these were the most renowned men of their houses. They are also, not coincidentally, the three greatest Holy Roman Emperors. It was with Charles Magnus, or Charlemagne, that the western line of the Holy Roman Emperors was founded again. He was crowned emperor in A.D. 800 at Rome after taking his army up the Rhine to destroy the power of the Lombards and

secure the control of Rome for the Pope. Charles and the Carolingian house was a brief, bright flame in a sea of chaos. His seat was in Aachen (or Aix) in the Rhine Valley west of Cologne. Otto I was crowned king of the Franks in A.D. 936 and Emperor of Rome in A.D. 962. He revived the power and prestige of the title "Emperor" after its lapse after Charlemagne's death. The last emperor of which I speak, Frederick Barbarossa, was crowned in A.D. 1152. He reigned until 1190 A.D., the longest reign of any Holy Roman Emperor before the rise of the Hapsburgs. The Duchy of Swabia covers that area east of the Rhine between Basel in the south and Worms in the north. It was bordered by the Duchy of Lorraine to the west, Franconia to the north, the Duchy of Bavaria to the east, Italy to the south, and Burgundy to the southwest. It took up all of the present-day Black Forest as well as part of Switzerland and Western Austria.

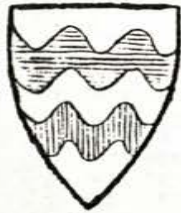

We will also have other activities. The regularly scheduled fighter practice will be in a field close by. We will also have mideival games like chess and tarot.

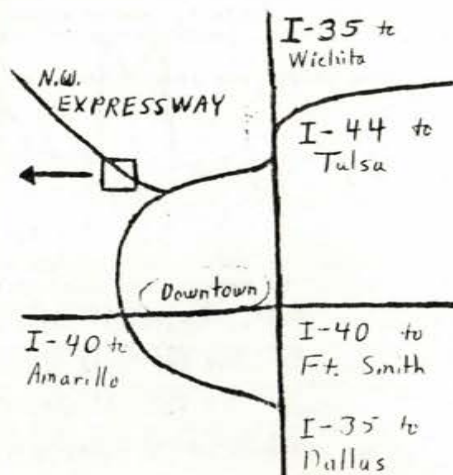
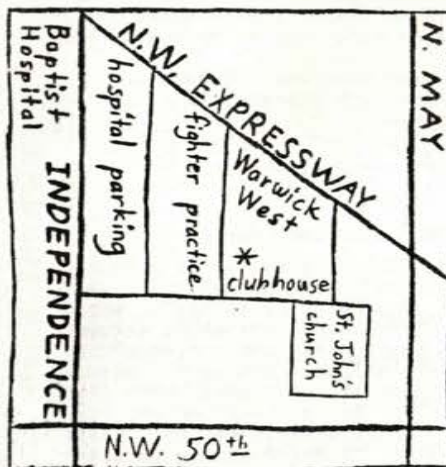
