



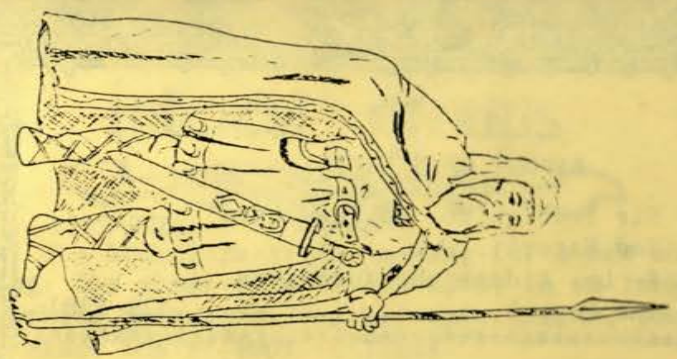

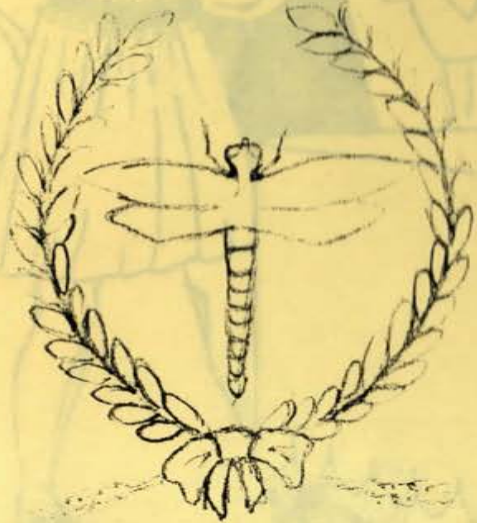

From the Seneschal



Good Morrow, all. There has been much discussion since we lost our keep about getting another. It looked as though we found the perfect place, but at the last moment, the deal fell through because of such mundane considerations as lack of fire escapes and insurance.

A number of people have asked if we are still looking for a new keep. Yes, we are. No, we have not found anything. Why? Money, that's why. Including utilities, it cost us about \$250 a month for the SCA's portion of the keep. The large keep we were looking at was \$350 a month, all utilities paid. The only way we could make that is that the Smithy had pledged \$100 a month. With the current situation, we can only afford \$250 a month, total. If we find someplace, it would have to be about \$150 a month. Most of the places I have seen want \$300 to \$400 + utilities for areas smaller than we had at the old keep.

It is very hard for the Seneschal and Baronage to sign a lease for a property we are not sure we can keep. Signing a lease means we will pay a sum for a year's lease on a building. If you sign a lease for a year at \$200 a month, it means you owe \$2400 dollars. The Barony has an obligation to the SCA to keep itself solvent and not to put itself into debt without being able to meet the debt.

So, does this mean we can't have a keep? Maybe, right now. But this does not mean the end of the group. Yes, it won't be as easy. But the Barony has prospered in the past without one. It will be just fine if we can't. We have a lot going for us, and we will be able to continue to break new ground in many areas. If personal and group accomplishment and excellence means anything to this populace, this won't even slow us down.

A large segment of the populace have told me we really NEED a keep, many of them having joined in the last year, only knowing a V'tavia with a keep. Please understand, a keep is very good for us.

But it has it's problems, too. The biggest is that it has turned us into money grubbers. In the last several years we have had enough money from our RenFair to pay as we go, and the populace didn't need to put their own money into the group. We know that the SCA is an expensive hobby, and people already put a large amount of money into their hobby, by way of armor, garb, traveling, etc. We then found ourselves in the situation that we had to come up with money the group didn't have to finish our obligations. We had to ask the populace to pay for the keep. I don't like sounding like Jim Bakker (Yes, folks, if you can send us just \$10 or \$20 or \$10,000, we won't have to close down the tourney...) begging for money. (I thought about having God "call me home" but was told that the only way to make money that way was to have God "call me home" if the money WAS paid! Oh well...) Money problems is something SCA folk don't like to deal with. I have enough money problems mundanely, I don't want to hand my friends about money.

Another problem has been upkeep and repair. Most cleanups were done by the same people, time after time. At times the keep became very dirty, and this is something we never were able to work out to anyone's satisfaction. In my opinion, this took away from the enjoyment of the Society.

I don't want to sound like a spoilsport or a wet blanket. But the problems with paying for a building are very real. How could we do it? Here is one way.

A small part of our group have been doing the lion's share of the work for the group. Only a small part had given any money toward rent for the keep. This will need to change. TANSNAFL. "There's No Such Thing as a Free Lunch." I know not everyone could afford to help, but more could have given SOMETHING! I don't, however, like to run a group on donations. If everyone chipped in and worked toward doing something for the group, no one would have to pay.

Ren Fair is coming soon. We could make things to sell to swell coffers! We will need EVERYONE to help, Ren Fair is a busy 4 days, but we have made large amounts of money in years past.

We could use our skills to make things to sell on a regular basis to the mundane world and to SCA folk on a regular basis. This would not be easy, but we have the talent and people that it could happen, but not as it has been in the past. But when we try to get together to make things, we get the same few people. Many say they will come, but few do. We need everyone to stop spectating and start participating. The people that come to an event for a few minutes and leave should start giving their hard work and time to the Barony. We could make enough to pay for a keep without it coming out of anyone's pocket.

If everyone will give, we can do anything. If they won't, maybe we don't deserve a keep of our own.

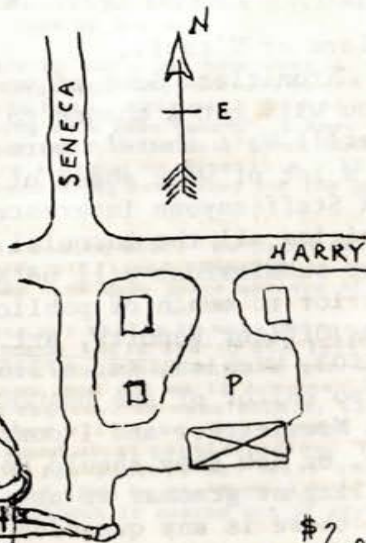

Who's Who in D'tabia

Aindries Asher

Firstly, let it be stated that many of the inaccuracies or any lack of information on Goodman Asher may be attributed to the very nature of Asher's life as a traveler, thereby making it very difficult to confirm or dispute much of the information known. Also, the fact that Asher likes it that way doesn't help.

As the story goes, Aindries Asher was born in the last year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Mary I of England, in the year 1558. (This in itself is not a remarkable fact with the exception of a few matters.) Aindries, whose mother was Welsh, was born the second son to a Scottish laird in the north lands. Although not for certain, it has been reported the Highland laird of Clan Gillespie to which Aindries was born to. The other matter of import is that the laird's first son, Ulliam, was very jealous.

Therefore, when a few years later, after the laird had died, Aindries thought it better to face the world than to possibly risk his life by facing his brother. So, collecting a few items, Aindries left and decided to see what the world offered.

Little is known of exactly where Aindries' travels as a certainty, but some few scant facts are known.

At some time, shortly after he left his village, he decided to join a monastery, and although he was a fairly receptive student, the solitude and the religious dogma proved to be too much for him and he soon left.

Like a pendulum swinging from one extreme to another, Aindries decided to try his luck as a soldier. Again, he proved to be fairly successful in this field of endeavour, it, too, soon grew stale and uninviting.

It is necessary to point out, at this time that part of the reason that it is so difficult to trace Asher's joinies is because of the variety of names that he traveled under. Never meaning to purposefully deceive anybody, Aindries found it convenient to change names as circumstances dictated. If he was traveling in England, because of the heavy amounts of suspicion that Scots drew, he would often go by the name of Andrew Asher. If traveling in the southern sections of Scotland, he would go by the name Aindries Asher. However, on occasions where his brother might have chance to hear of him, Aindries applied a twist of his odd sense of humor and went by the name Aindries Ulliam. He could really think of no more suitable ruse or pull on his sour, irascible brother who had a very poor sense of humor, anyway, than if he were ever to learn that his brother, whom he dearly disliked, had been using his name for many years. Aindries chose a name simply to suit his needs.

After a bit of wandering, Aindries finally decided that the thing he best enjoyed was amusing people and making them happy. Well, this seemed easy enough, after all, one of the major benefits of travel is that it expands a person's horizons, as well as his knowledge, and Aindries was usually abounding with stories, so he decided that it could best serve him by best serving others, at least as long as they would have him.

So, full of mirth and cheer, Aindries went through life being as much a fool, a minstrel, a bard, and a dandy as he could be. Occasionally he would slip into fits of remorse or contemplation, but these rarely lasted long. All it would take would be for him to realize that

things weren't as bad as they could be, then just to think of maid, or mirth or mischief that he had known or been part of, and usually life would be fine.

It is not known when or where Aindries died, but what is known is that there was quite an event. After a life of bringing laughter to the faces of men, Aindries could not have gone out any other way. One time when talking to a barmaid who was sorely despondent over the loss of her lord, he explained to her, "Life is too short to wallow in the mire of depression. There is nothing that can ever be undone or unsaid, so drink deep from the cup of life, it may only come around once. And never, ever regret."

Calontir Becomes a Kingdom a chronicle by Jayce Ravenhair

On the night of February 17th, A. S. XVIII, many V'tavians journeyed to the frozen northlands of Maq Mor to join those of Calontir's citizens who had come to witness the birth of a new kingdom. Despite the inclement weather, there was much excitement and anticipation of the event to come.

A blanket of snow covered the ground but nothing would weigh down the spirits of those who had come to be part of what was to be a most glorious day in the history of Calontir. Among those who attended were many visiting nobility, including Their Royal Magesties, King Alen and Queen Genevieve, Duke Sir Laurelen and Duke Talimar of the Middle Kingdom. From the Kingdom of Ansteora came Calontir's dear friends, Count Finn O'Donnell and Crown Prince and Princess Inman and Arrowyn.

The first order of the day was the last court of Their Serene Highnesses, Prince Cire and Princess Elisabeth. Among the awards presented were Award of Arms for V'tavia's Dana Latona, Victoria Cortés y Ferrara, and Hywellis Brych Mer Wyddel. To Their Serene Highnesses the finished Cape of Calontir was presented.

With court concluded the long-awaited tournament began. From all of Calontir, eighteen men were chosen to compete in the first Calontir Crown Tournament. Of those chosen, two were from our Barony. Viscount Baron Humpk de Bohun and Robert of the Woodlands were among the valiant fighters who met that day on the list. Viscount Baron Humpk proceeded through the list to the semi-finals before being beaten by Sir Aethelred the Jute. In the finals were Sir Aethelred and Chepe l'Oragere. After three emotion-filled bouts and much cheering for both, Chepe was declared victor and new King of Calontir.



While the tourney was being held, a fine collection of Calontir's Arts and Sciences were displayed. Among the magnificent articles were several pieces done by V'tavia's own citizens.

As evening drew nigh, Their Royal Magesties, Alen and Genevieve held their last court as King and Queen over Calontir. Their Magesties released the Peerage and Officers of Calontir from their oaths of fealty. With much emotion Prince Cire and Princess Elisabeth stepped down as Calontir's last Prince and Princess.

Chepe was called into court and Calontir's citizens witnessed as he was crowned as the first King of Calontir. His consort, Baroness Arwynn Antarae, was then called forward and crowned as Queen of Calontir. Used in the ceremony were a pair of capes presented by Their Magesties of the Middle. The capes were first used in the coronation of Hugo and Caitlain, King and Queen when Calontir was made a Principality.

Adding to the drama of the evening, the new Crowns of Calontir were presented only moments before the actual coronation. After some confusion Tynn the Mysterious, skillful crafter of the beautiful pieces, had raced the wind to bring the crowns from his workshop in V'tavia.

Following the coronation the populace of Calontir gathered to feast together. V'tavia's Erlich du Battenhelm and Christiana Beauchasteau assisted in preparing the meal that was served to the new King and Queen. Many presentations were made, among them a pair of thrones by Baron Humpk and Baroness Mammara Leona. Pillows for the thrones were presented by Hywellis and Tuia Kynara of Illyricum.

Following a court filled with presentations to the new Magesties of Calontir was a revel held at the Harvester. Much celebrating abounded and went on far into the night.

The next morning brought clearing skies and pleasant weather for the trip back home to V'tavia. All seemed in a festive mood and brought back many pleasant memories of the First Calontir Crown Tournament.

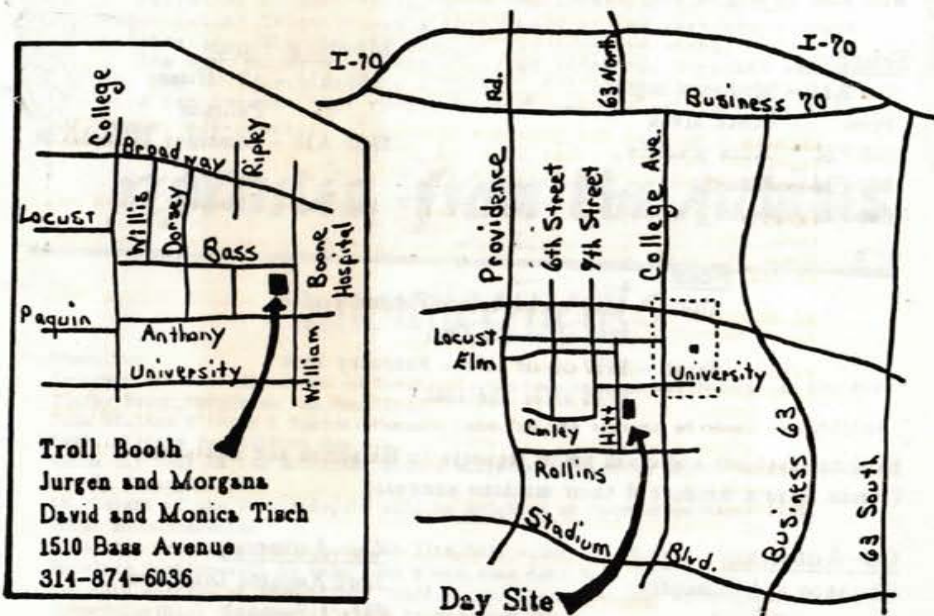
From the South: Take the Broadway exit from 63 North and turn left (west). Continue west on Broadway to William and turn left. The house is at the corner of William and Bass (on your left).
