



AFTER YOU HAVE EXPERIENCED AS MANY INTERESTS AS POSSIBLE DECIDE ON A FEW ACTIVITIES TO PRACTICE SERIOUSLY. TALK TO EVERYONE YOU CAN BOTH INSIDE AND OUT OF THE BARONY WHO KNOWS ABOUT YOUR INTEREST. LEARN HOW TO DO YOUR OWN RESEARCH. SOON, PEOPLE WILL COME TO YOU FOR KNOWLEDGEAND ADVICE.

LEARN HOW TO USE YOUR OWN SKILLS IN THE BEST INTEREST OF THE GROUP. FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU HAVE ANY KNOWLEDGE OF JOURNALISM, VOLUNTEER TO BE ON THE DRAGONFLYRE STAFF.

IF YOU DECIDE SERVICE IS YOUR BAILIWICK, THERE ARE MANY AVENUES AVAILIBLE. TO WHICH TO HARNESS YOUR ENTHUSIASM. FOR EXAMPLE. LEARN FROM SOMEONE WHO IS EXPERIENCED ON HOW TO AUTOCRAT OR FEASTOCRAT AN EVENT. THEN, PLAN A MINI-EVENT FOR THE BARONY. THE NEXT STEP IS TO DO A KINGDOM EVENT.

ANOTHER POSSIBILITY FOR SERVICE IS A STINT AS A OFFICER. CHOOSE AN OFFICE YOU WOULD LIKE TO FILL. FIND OUT THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THAT OFFICETO SEE IF YOU HAVE THE SKILLS NECESSARY. (IF NOT, PROCEED TO LEARN THEM) ASK A CURRENT OFFICER TO TAKE YOU AS A DEPUTY. ALL MAJOR OFFICERS SHOULD HAVE AT LEAST ONE. IF THE OFFICER HAS PLENTY OF DEPUTIES, ASK THEM TO TEACH YOU HOW THE OFFICE IS RUN. ALL OF US IN THE SCA ARE OBLIGATED TO SHARE OUR KNOWLEDGE. (OFFICERSIT IS YOUR DUTY TO TEACH ANYONE WHO EXPRESSES AN INTEREST. YOU MAY NOT NEED THE HELP NOW, BUT V'TAVIA DOES NOT CEASE TO EXIST THE DAY YOU STEP DOWN. IT IS V'TAVIA'S FUTURE IN TOUR HANDS- GUARD IT AND GUIDE IT.) WHENEVER AN OFFICE BECOMES VACANT DO THESE THINGS:

1. DETERMINE IF THE OFFICE IS ONE TOU WANT TO DO FOR

THE OFFICE'S SAKE (NOT YOUR OWN SAKE)

2. EXAMINE YOUR ABLITIES CAREFULLY AND SEE IF YOU ARE KNOWLEDGABLE ENOUGH TO HANDLE THAT OFFICE. IF NOT, THEN WAIT TILL NEXT TIME. (WE'RE IN THIS FOR THE LONG TERM, REMEMBER?)

SOME OFFICES CAN BE FILLED (EXPECIALLY DEPUTY ONE'S) WITH LITTLE EXPERIENCE IN THE SCA. SOME OFFICES CANNOT BE DONE WITHOUT LONG TERM EXPERIENCE IN THE SCA. WHEN YOU ACHIEVE THAT EXPERIENCE, YOU WILL APPIECIATE WHY.

SOME PEOPLE MAKE EXCEPTIONALLY GOOD OFFICERS. THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS TO V'TAVIA HELP KEEP IT VIABLE AND MAKE IT WORTHWHILE. V'TAVIA IS OBLIGATED TO USE THESE PEOPLE AS LONG AS THEY ARE WILLING AND EFFECTIVE. THAT IS WHY YOU MAY SEE ONE PERSON FILL SEVERAL OFFICES IN THE SPAN OF A FEW YEARS. The Height of Anglo-Saxon England 900-1013

Anglo-Saxon England is best remembered from the disaster it suffered at the hands of the Normans in 1066. The image of the Saxons as a powerless, defeated underclass is enhanced by the legends of Robin Hood. But Robin Hood is an anchronism of the fourteenth century, and the glories of Norman and Plantagenet England rest on the foundations laid by the Anglo-Saxons. This essay explores those foundations.


Anglo-Saxon England almost died aborning. It survived only by the military and political genius of Alfred the Great. Before Alfred, England was broken up into seven kingdoms: the Hentarchy (Kent, Sussex, Wessex, Essex, Northumbria, East Anglia, Mercia). But as Alfred's reign began, England was being overrun with vet another invasion, this time out of Denmark and Norway. By sheer determination Alfred was able to stem this tide and preserve Anglo-Saxon culture.

Alfred achieved this by a series of innovations and revisions of past practices. He organized the first English fleet to counter the sea mobility of the Vikings. On land he reorganized the theons and ford into two sections. While one would be attending to the defense of Wessex, the other would be at home seeing to the ordinary domestic duties. After a set period they would switch off. This allowed Alfred a longer campaigning period against the Danes. To counter their raiding tactics, he had fortifications or burghs built thoughout the land to serve as points of resistance and safety. Most of these were not much more then earthworks on open ground, but many became the sites of future towns.

But Alfred's contributions were not solely restricted to things military. He called into being the Anglo-Saxon Chronole, unique by the fact it was written in English. He also had the laws codified and written down. He encouraged the learning of Latin and the translation of works of literature into English. While Alfred's direct contrubutions to culture are a matter of debate, he succeeded in fostering the climate to allow it to flourish.

With the exception of the taking of London in 886. Alfred spent most of his career holding back the successes of the Danes and then reversing them. It was his offspring Edward (who succeeded him as king) and Ethelfleda of Mercia who began the reconquest of the Danelaw, the lands under the rule of the Danes. The conquest was finished by his grandson Ethelstan in 937 at the battle of Brunanburh, though it would be another twenty years before this victory could be solidified.

The next forty years were relatively peaceful. as the descendents of Alfred consolidated their rule, and the Anglo-Saxon culture was at its height. But it was not to last. Starting around 980, a new wave of Viking raiders began, this time out of Norway. In 991 the Vikings under Ulaf Tryggyesson defeated the English forces at the battle of Maldon. Complete defeat was avoided by the payment of large sums of money. Twice more that decade England was subject to large raids, which were paided off. The large Scandinavain silver hordes came from these



English bribes ----

These events and those that followed were due in large to the weaknesses of the king. Ethelred Unraed (the Unreadv): the literal translation being Noble-Counsel No-Counsel. Under the pretense that his subject Danes were plotting to kill him. Ethelred had them slaughtered in 1002. including the sister of the king of Denmark. Swein. Vowing revenge. Swein invaded the following year. and then again in 1013. this time to conquer. as Ethelred's forces deserted him. Swein died the next year. His son Cnut. unprepared, withdrew from England, but was back for good two years later. The fortunes of England were about to change.


One of the more remarkable aspects of this period was the lack of rancor between the Danes and the English. As the Danelaw was reconquered, the Danish population which had settled there were simply assimilated into the general population and life of the English kingdom. In 942 Oda, a full blooded Dane, was made Archbishop of Canterbury. More over, the English army slowly took on a Danish cast as the Anglo-Saxon farmer became more inclined to let the fighting to the more militant Danish thegas. It should be pointed out that Ethelred's problems were due to his failures as leader not the make up of his forces.

This accommodation with the Danes left its marks on many aspects of Anglo-Saxon life. The most significant was that England was broken into three cultural regions. There was the Danelaw, where the Vikings had permanently settled down: Wessex, which was never under Viking control: and Merica which was a transitional between the two. These differences manifested themselves in the names of people and places, and in the local customs and laws that they followed. But in the ways they lived day to day, the differences were not so pronounced, as both groups came from the same roots and similar environments.

One of the unifying factors was the Christian Church. In fact. Edward would often send priests ahead of his conquering armies to convert the pagan Danes to Christianity. The original Viking invasions had all but wiped out the native cleroy, to the extent that Alfred had to send to France for teachers and ordinary brothers to found communities. By 950, the Danes had all been converted to Christianity, though many pagan practices continued. During the last half of the tenth century, under Dunstan. Archbishop of Canterbury. England participated in the great Benedictine reform that sweept the continent.

The best description of Anglo-Saxon life is in the poem Beowulf. While set on the Danish peninsula, the life it paints spans the early Germanic culture, of which the Anglo-Saxon were a part. Among the aspects it portrays is the importance of kin, as each individual looked to their kin to obtain justice, or to seek vengence if killed. The concept of weregild was instituted to cut down on the blood-feuds that this engendered. The king leads by example and is expected to be generous to his followers. And the true measure of a man was his performance in battle, particuarly in the face of his own death. These themes also occur in the poem. "The Battle of Maldon".

Ethelred was not the last Anglo-Saxon king. His son Edward

the Contessor was. But it was Ethelred who nevertheless set up the final fall. To secure support against Swein, he had married Emma, the daughter of the Duke of Normandy: their son was Edward. This connection is what allowed William of Normandy to lay claim to the crown of England.

When William conquered England in 1066, he replaced wholesale the upper aristocracy, but left intact, and used, the basic Thus it was the Anglo-Saxon institutions of the Anglo-Saxons. financial organization, first set to collect the Danegild, that financed the Angevin Empire of Henry II. and the Crusade of Richard the Lionhearted. It was the Anglo-Saxon ford, that formed the backbone the English armies which had so much success It was the Anglo-Saxon system of on the medieval battlefields. moots evolving into various courts, which encouraged the concepts of local self-rule. Which, in time, put a brake on the powers of the monarchy, leading to democratic government. And it was the laws first formulated in those moots that became the basis of English common law. which governs us yet today. Thus the Anglo-Saxon civilization lives on today.



Note from Kendall: Cloak pins were worn with the pin up during wartime and with the pin down during peacetime. Reason being, if someone were to try to grab a fighter during a war the pin would stab that person, but was worn down during peacetime as to not stab a friend.

Based primarily on definitions supplied by Oaksshott¹, a sword may be divided into several components: the blade, the tang, the cross, the pommel and the grip. The latter three together are called the hilt. The drawings to the right show those components.


The smith who fashioned a blade (and tang) did not necessarily fashion the other portions of the sword. The grip might be replaced may times during the life of a sword. Both pommel and cross might also be replaced more than once.


Early swords had blades designed to cut or hack through leather, padded cloth and mail. As armor developed, blades changed and sharpened points were developed to allow the blade to drive through metal plate. Limiting himself to only two-edged, non-curved blades, Oakeshott describes some 11 different blade types, with variations on most of those, to produce a total of 24 different types of blades created during the period from 1050 to 1550.


Oakeshott believes the term quillons, which is used in SCA books (e.g., The Fighter's Handbook) was not used until at least the end of the 16th Century. Cross is the term Oakeshott feels is more correct. He describes some 12 different types of crosses in his book.

He describes approximately 40 different powmels existing during the 500 year period covered by his book, but variations on each of these was possible by variations in the use of metals, jewels, carvings and inscriptions. Two examples of possible are shown to the right. Grips might be made of wood, bone, horn, or metal. They might be left uncovered or covered with combinations of wire, cloth, or leather.

To those of us trying to select a sword for our personna, this range of differences certainly opens a somewhat greater number of options than most of us would have considered. Oakesnott suggests that period paintings may be one of the best ways to identify the style of weapons actually carried or used at a specific time and locale.

GENERAL CAMPING RULES.

This event is a non-reservation event. Camps may be established on or after August 8th. This is when the Autocrat will be on site. Once the autocrat is on site, gentles who wish to hold a large area of ground must observe the following regulations:

1. On a 8 1/2 by 11 inch sheet of paper, clearly written place the following information; Mundane name, SCA name, group name, number and size of tents.

2. Make several copies of this information sheet. . 3. Give one Copy to the Autocrat. I will be at

autocrat's point or the Security tent as of Augest 8th. 4. The second copy should be posted clearly at your encampment. This copy should be protected from the elements.

5. Rope off your area and set up your camp. An area for fire pits and a cout should be taken into account when setting up your encampment.

These lists serve several purposes. The sheet shows the group's need for hold a large area. If someone complains about the size of a group's encampment, I can justify the use of that land. This should prevent the misuse of land by groups who take to much land. The area you have roped off will be recorded on a master mapkept by the autocrat. The list will also make it easier to find you incase of an emergency. This list is the final word on land disbutes. Land will be recorded on a first come first serve basis on and after August 8th. The time before this will not be considered to be an SCA event. No group should send or mail any list to the autocrat before they arive on site. These lists are not reservations. They simply show where your camp is located.

Ghost encampments will not be allowed. There must be at least one person camping within a roped off area. All encampments should have a fire extinguisher. The extinguisher should be rate for chemical, liquid fires, nylon and etc. Indiviual campers should bring a basic first aid kit. Sunburn, scrapes, insect bites an many other small accidents can be taken care of easily, without a long trip to chiurgens point. Gentles should bring there own picnic tables, as there is never enough of them to go around. The tables are usually grabbed by the early arrivals. An area will be held for those gentles who are not camping with any of the large groups. Those gentles who have only one or two tents and no one to stay with on the site.



Minors attending the war, must be accompanied by their parent or legal guardian. A letter appointing a temporary guardian is not a satisfactory substitute. No minor is allowed to participate in combat at the war. Pets are not permitted to attend the war. They will not be allowed onto the site.

This year we are maintaining a twenty four hour security point, located at the circle by the barn. This will also be the site of the Lost and Found.

There will be activities taking place during the week of the 15th of August. There will be different tournaments taking place during the week. The war points will be fought on Friday through Sunday. Classes will begin on Monday morning and run through the week. A Page's School will be open to children five years of age and older. Archery will take place throughout the entire week. Thursday night there shall be a Masked Ball in the barn. The theme of the dance will be "Fire and Ice". If you are interested in participating on more than a casual level, ie. you want to teach or perform, please contact the appropriate sub-autocrat listed below.

Armour inspection for the war points will begin at 10:00 am. on Thursday and continue upto the battles. There is a Marshall's Point for armour inspection. Armour inspected before this time, for the daily tournaments is not considered inspected for the war points.

There is always need for volunteers to help the war effort. We are looking for gentles to help in several areas of the war. The Troll booth is always in need of groups to work on the off hours. Security will be organizing a neighborhood watch. Musicians are needed for the masked ball on Thursday night. There will be an auction with the proceeds to aid the growing costs of our chiurgens. Please, donate or buy what you can afford.

Below is the tenative schedule of events. A final schedule of events will be given to all gentles upon arrival at the troll booth. This booklet will have the time and place of events at the war.






