The Caltrap Staff meeting scheduled for August 6 was cancelled due to the lack of the Internal Letter of Intent from Saker Herald and the press of the other things Caltrap was committed to do.

The Caltrap Staff performed valiantly at the XIth Tourney of Valor and deserve a commendation and my heartfelt gratitude for a job very well done. The Vatavians who served included







Lords Aindries ap Daffyd and Eion Scott na Daingniche who provided Camp and List Heraldry services, Ladies Ceithlenn nic Ruaidhri and Hrafnhildr o Llandyssol who called Lists, and Ladies Allana, Searlaith nic Villiam o' Cellaigh and Marie Chantal Delaire who assisted at the Heraldic Consultation table and prepared notes for the Court reports. Twelve Gentles were assisted at the Consultation table, nine with design of devices, two with choice of names and one submission accepted. Visiting Heralds who assisted Caltrap Staff were Lords Draigen MacConn, Andreus of Green Village, and Baron Christopher Amber and Ladies Thryi Haraldsdottir and Kristabel of Breirrose Keep. #### Baronial Court of Vatavia

Unto Their Excellencies Baron Gawayne ap Tristram and Baroness Brialen Ulfsdottir Vikingr, The Lords, Ladies and good Gentles of Vatavia, send greetings and this report.

Baronial Court of Vatavia July 29, AS XXV (1990)

Their Excellencies Baron Sir Tedrick von Wolfschatten and Baroness Aideen the Audacious presided over a Court of the Barony of Vatavia the evening of the twenty-ninth day of July in the twenty-fifth year of the Society held on the front lawn of the Kansas Newman College.

Court was convened ar forty-five minutes past the hour of five by Lady Annys de Vernun of Kettering, Caltrap Pursuivant, assissted by Lord Aindries ap Daffyd and Lady Searlaith nic Villiam O'Ceallaigh. Lord Aindries read the banns of the adoption of Lord Frederick Park of Alcyon by Milady Maeve de Navarre Kelly and her Lord lan Michael. Competition and Archery Dragon-shoot at Interkingdom Peace held on Sundays on the Kansas Newman front lawn. Lady Brialen Ulfsdottir Vikingr told the populace of the disappearance of the fabric for the Baronial Capes following the July Populace meeting and asked for its return.

Miladies Lora Anne the Silent and Lelia ni LAachtnain Uf Chathail presented Tabards and Capuchin hoods for the Baronial Guard to the Barony on behalf of the costume Guild. Lady Marie Chantal Delaire, acting for Caltrap, called Lady Brialen Ulfsdottir Vikingr, Lord Dirik von Rosswald and Milady Lora Anne the Silent before the Court. The accepteance for registration of their devices by the Knowne World College of Arms was proclaimed and these Good Gentles each placed a copy of their devices on the Vatavian Roll of Arms. With her written permission, the device of Lady Caitrin nic Ruaidhi was also placed on the Roll.

In recognition of their support of the Society by means of a paid membership, Milords William Fidgett and Conrad, son of Lelia, were named Citizens of Vatavia and were presented with azure Cords of Citizenship.

Lord Tristan Rory de Jores was summoned before their Excellencies and commanded to explain his failure to present the three gallons of Clove Mead he had offered to the Baron as a bribe to forego his Duoit de Signeur. Lord Tristan explained that the brewing had not produced drinkable product, apologized abjectly and promised to try again.

Awards for Victory in Competition were presented to Lady Annys de Vernun of Kettering for the Vatavian Christmas Court AS XXIV Arts and Sciences Competition, Lord Tristan Rory de Jores for Interkingdom Peace AS XXV Arts and

Lady Gwendolynn Morna O'Shaughnessey was summoned to report on the progress of her Lord, Zanni the Lost, in his quest to Fletch an arrow worthy of his Lady. She promissed it would be ready by Valor Tourney X1.

Awards for Achievement in Science were presented to Milords Throdmar Thorgrimsson and Rhys von Pohlman for Chainmail, Col Murrough and Fergus for Armoring, and Haakon Thorhallsson for Armoring and Chainmail. Lord Tristan Rory de Jores accepted the award for his Lady Kera de Jores for brewing. Milady Mistra of Hammerstorm was presented with an Award for Achievement in Art for her artwork for the Dragonflyre and banners for the House Hammerstorm.

Lady Odindessa and Milord Brude were summoned and were assigned Quests. Lady Odindessa is required to present the Lost Eye of Odin and the Sage of how it was lost and Milord Brude is required to present the muzzle of the Finnerious Beast.

Awards for Acts of Dedication were presented to Milady Lelia ni Lachtnain Uf Chathail for her work on the Tabards and to Milady Lora Anne the Silent for her work on the Capuchin Hoods for the Baronial Guard. Ladies Searlaith nic Villiam O'Ceallaigh and Marie Chantal Delaire received awards for Acts of Dedication for their assistance at Heraldic Consultations and in Conflict Research for the Herald's Staff. Milady Mistra of Hammerstorm was presented with an award for her Act of Dedication in her help with the Dragonflyre.







The Victors in that days Tourney, Lord Rinald il Bianco, in Bastard Sword, and Lord Fredrick Park of Alcyon, in Weapon and Shield and Weapon of Choice, and Milord Balroc in Archery were announced.

At the request of Her Excellency, Baroness Aideen, Lady Brialen Ulfsdottir Vikingr announced the Kingdom policy that smoking at official events of the Society is forbidden.

Lord Aubrey Kendal of Rosewood and his Lady, Susan, were summoned and were assigned Quests. Lord Kendal is required to present a piece of the Forge of Wayland the Smith, and Milady Susan is required to present the Bookmark of Saint Peter's Book of Life.



Who's Who In Vatavia (reprint from Nov. AS XIX)

I am Lawrence Taillefer the Leech, 3rd son of a French merchant and landholder of the county of Champagne. My father left his holdings there to avoid the heavy taxes of Phillip Augustus in 1182 (some say-at their peril-it was to avoid service in his crusade against the Albigenses.) In any event he sold his holdings and fled across the Rhine to assume better control of the holdings of his wife, my mother in the Duchy of Franconia. He became a Master of Copper works in Frankfurt and set up a comfortable life for himself and his family.

My brothers faired well in their senority as my eldest holds heirship to my fathers holdings and place in the crafthall and my older brother is an assistant to the Cardianl of Cologne.("a good priest" it is said of him)]

As for me, I enjoyed the fruit of irresponsibility, for much of









my youth was spent avoiding training in my father's craft, and running free through the streets of Frankfurt. It was after one bloody, football game that my father saw fit to enlist me into the service of a noble...ah....a military life for me....

My lord was a fair man and entrusted my training in the arts of war to a hardfisted soldier named Claus the Deformed (from a careless habit of his youth in blocking a dagger with his left hand-you can well imagine the effect). The man knew the trade of soldiery well and taught me all he knew, and with all the strife of lord against lord in the absence of King Frederick II (1220-1250 of the Hohenstaufen line), I was war hardened at sixteen.

My lot fell to be in the service of Cardinal at Castle Dracenfeld in 1217 just prior to the seige of the Rhine strongehold and there I became acquainted to the surgeon of the Keep. I showed some promise at tending battle wounds, and he taught me what he could of his craft and magic. The castel fell six years later, as the north wall collapsed due to the work of Sappers, and our force surrendered. Fortunately, the Pope's Truce of God prevented our deaths, and I was freed to wander the Germanic lands, selling my skills as healer and swordsman where I would.

My sword swung in many a fight over what seemed like less ground than a man could stand on as Lord sought to displace Lord. If Frederick II had returned from southern Italy many nobles would band together to enforce their rights of holding. He was much acursed for his efforts to wrest control of these fiefs from the nobles and place them in his complete control. I heard much talk of mercenaries massing under his banner in the Kingdom of the Sicilies for just this purpose, but nothing much came from these rumors. (The mantel of the Holy











Roman Emperor does much to increase a kings thoughts of himself) It would seem that he had enough to concern himself with in Sicily to worry with lands of the North. (and its half-breeds)

I traveled a great deal finally setting in V'tavia where in view of the fairness of the land it's people, I will reside awhile.

The Legend of Arthur by Ld. Thomas Bacon (from the June XVI A.S.)

It is though the legend of King Arthur that most people first become acquainted with the Middle Ages. Since he burst upon the literary scene in the 12th century, King Arthur has been the most popular and enduring figure in popular folklore, rivaled only by the heroes of Homer's epic poems. Even today new tellings of his story appear regularly.

The historical Arthur is hidden by mists of the past. In the few records that survived, there are only brief mentions of him by name, and one other passage that could be applied to him. And that is all. All else is legend.

The fifth century was a perilous time in Britain. The Roman legions that had protected her had made their last appearance on the Island in 418. Hope of their return remained until 446, but to no avail. Meanwhile, Vortigern, a native taking over from the Romans, had invited some Saxons from Germany to help him fight the Scots and Picts, who were coming down from the north. But the two Saxon leaders, Hengest and Horsa, turned on Vortigern, and thus began the Saxon invasions, at a date usually recorded as 455.

The earliest account of what occurs next is given by the monk Gildas in about 540. While he wrote his treatise, "De









Excidio et Conquesta Britanniae," mainly to deplore the wickedness of the current kings, he did give a brief account of the recent history. In it he mentions that resistance to the Saxons was organized by Ambrosius Aurelianus, a Roman descendent, which ended victoriously with the battle of Mons Badonicus, or Badon Hill. Bede, who relied primarily on Gildas, dates the battle as 493 in his "A History of the English Church and People."

The next account of the period was written in 858 by the monk Nennius. In his "History of the Britons," he lists 12 battles that Arthur fought against the Saxons, with the final victory occurring at Mount Badon. The only other mentions of Arthur occur in the "Annales Cambriae," which puts the battle of Badon in 518 and notes that in the battle of Camlann in 539, Arthur and Medraut died. The mists of time reveal no more.

The battle of Badon is important in that it stopped the Saxon advance. There was an outflow of Saxons during the next four decades and even the "Anglo-Saxon Chronicle" says very little of this period. This respite ended in 552, and soon after, the island belonged to the Saxons.

The legend of Arthur begins in 1136 with the publication of Geoffrey of Monmouth's "The History of the Kings of Britain." It is here that we meet for the first time many of the now familiar details of the legend. Geoffrey wrote his book as a history, and even as late as 1620 was considered an authority. Much of his book, however, is more fanciful than factual as several contemporary historians have pointed out. Nevertheless, its popularity was immediate.

The sources of Geoffrey's work are unknown. The basic outline of the book is from Nennius, but little else. In his dedication, Geoffrey mentions having received a book in the British language, but most historians doubt its existence. To say that he made it all up is dangerous, as a number of





details have been found to be true. But for all its faults as history, it is a major piece of literature. Here we meet Merlin for the first time, as he gives a long prophecy to Vortigern as revealed by the fight between a red and a white dragon. The scene comes from Nennius, but in his work the prophecy was made by a Ambrosius, who would become the father of Aurelius Ambrosius. Geoffrey makes Aurelius the son of Constantine II, a real Roman general (c. 407), successor to Vortigern, and bother of Uther Pendragon, a name out of Celtic poems. Geoffrey also recounts the seduction of Igerna by Uther, including his shape change by Merlin. And here we learn of Arthur's end by the treachery of Mordred and his departure to the Isle of Avalon, which Geoffrey claims to have occured in 542.

While Geoffrey is the source of the basic Arthurian legend, it is not in the form wwith which we are familiar. Lancelot is not here, instead Arthur's champion is Gawain, a Celtic hero that had long been connected to Arthur in the Celtic legends of Wales. It is Modred with whom Guinevere runs off. Arthur's sword is named Caliburn, forged on the island of Avalon. But all the changes that would come later, the basic story and theme had been set.

The first to expand upon Geoffrey was Robert Wace in 1155. In a 15,000 line poem, the concept of Arthur's court as the Medieval ideal comes to the fore. It is he who introduces the Round Table.

He is followed by Chretien de Troyes, one of the most famous troubadours of the Middle Ages. It is Chretien who conceived of Lancelot, Galahad, and the Grail. Lancelot first appeared in the poem "Eric" as the chief knight in Arthur's court. In "Chevalier de la Chartte," Lancelot came to the forefront and became Guinevere's lover. Galahad made an appearence as the son of Lancelot and Elaine, the daughter of King Pallas. In the "Conte del Gra I," Chretien introduced the Grail theme,





with Percival as the hero. Chretien did not finish "Conte del Graal," and so various endings were composed by several writers, the most notable being Wolfram von Eschenbach.

In the following centuries, many romances were written with an Arthurian theme. A set of prose stories by Robert de Boron, known as the Vulgate cycle, is the nucleus around which the last major changes were made in the Arthurian legend. The sword in the anvil, the Morgain la Fee became a major character and was rendered as source of opposition. The stage was set for Sir Thomas Malory.

The person of Thomas Malory is as mysterious as the historical Arthur. All that is known of him is the colophon that William Caxon printed in the first edition of 1485. Whoever he was, Malory has become the touchstone for all later writers of Arthur. In his book, "Morte d'Arther," he achieved both a summation and a unification of all the romances and legends that surrounded Arthur. It is Malory who placed Camelot in that semi-mythical Golden Age that the name now evokes. It is an achievement that has few equals.

With Malory we have the Arthur legend in its final form. Since his time many writers have penned their own interpretations of the story: Tennyson, T.H. White, and Steinbeck the most prominent. Milton was about to write his own version before deciding to write "Paradise Lost." Even today, 500 years after "Morte d'Arthur," Arthur's appeal has not diminished and his story is told in books, plays, movies, comics, and other diverse forms of communication. The legend ends with Arthur being carried to Avalon where he lives until England's time of need. During the Middle Ages there was much argument as to the location of Avalon and whether Arthur still lived. But if Avalon is where our dreams and hope lie, then it is true that King Arthur is alive and well today.


