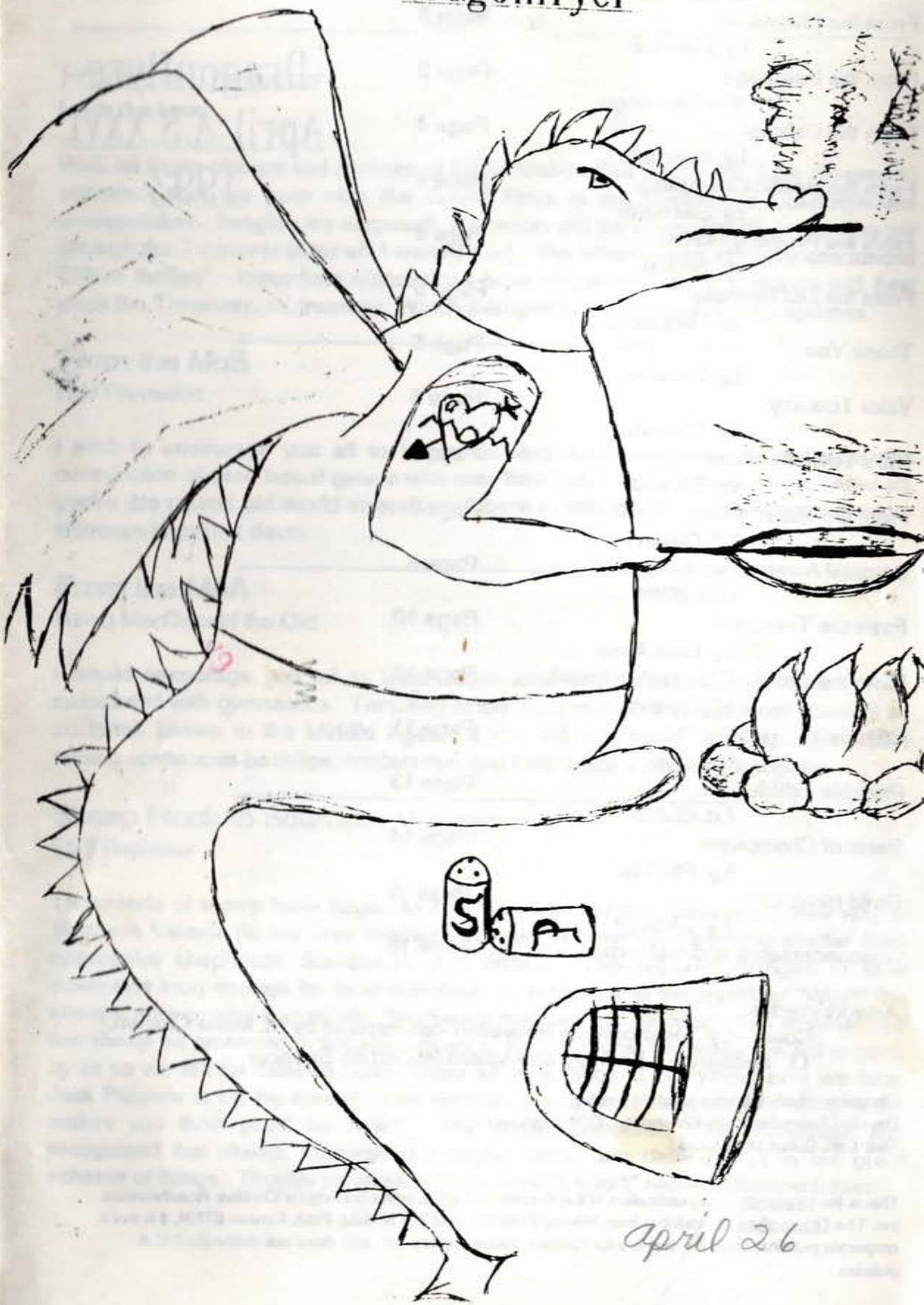

Following that is the Champions' event out at Taillefer and the Shakespeare's birthday demo. All of these will be showcases for the Arts and Sciences as embodied by the SCA..

The Kansas-Newman Rennfair will showcase our dancers and performers, as well as a demonstration of our martial interests and a display of our Arts and Sciences activities. I would encourage you all to participate fully in this event. I realize that the Triatian Conflict is the same weekend, but I hope that you desire to help your Barony during one of our two biggest events of the year (If you feeling guilty while reading this, that's the intent).

It has been my privilege to participate and to judge in a few arts and sciences competitions. I am impressed by some of the talent which lies within the Barony, but horrified at the documentation submitted. Your native artistry is not sufficient when using kingdom judging criteria. Those criteria demand that you demonstrate your knowledge of period materials and methods. I have seen beautiful clothing, illuminations that I would happily kill for, armor that would sell in a minute, and wines that would melt on the tongue. All receive some minimal number of points simply because the makers submitted very little or inappropriate documentation.

Documentation is fun for some and not for others. It is required to win. If you want to make beautiful garb simply to enjoy it and share its beauty with others, do so, but don't expect to win competitions. Do you want to produce some good tasting booze, but aren't too concerned to know whether it was even known in period? Great -- invite me over, but don't expect to win competitions. If you want to have a competition that doesn't require documentation, become an autocrat, have an event, and have such a competition (but decide how you will judge it before-hand).

Do you need help with documentation? We have some of the most skilled individuals you could want in Vatavia. What do you want some help with? Herbalism - contact Aelfric; Brewing - contact Sean or Aelfric; Fashion Design - contact Phillipa; Woodworking - contact Lawrence; Illumination - contact Raven. Marie Chantel, or Ala:

Armoring - contact Lawrence; cooking - contact Demetrius; Embroidery - contact Hywela; Weaving - contact Ceithlein. I didn't mention what you are interested in? Portable Edibles

With the Kansas Newman Renaissance Festival fast approaching, I thought I'd dedicate part of this column to ideas for avoiding the trip off site to a fast food joint. It does seem to be counter to the general atmosphere of the Faire to spend all that time and money creating garb fit for a late-period festival, preparing months in advance and then find yourself photographed while digging in a McDonald's bag.

I would like to offer these suggestions for your mealtime. Most of these items can be obtained pre-made/ready-to-eat from you local grocery store. While the forms of these are not necessarily the same forms from medieval period, they are still closer than a McBurger and large fries. Please keep in mind that many of these items need to be kept in your cooler for safety, flavor, or both.

Whole loaf bread - Like Italian and French loaves

Cheese - Some are sold with a wax wrapping which looks much better than plastic.

Summer Sausage - These don't require refrigeration until after opened.

Hard-cooked eggs - Start with the eggs in cold water to lessen the shell's cracking.

Deli chicken - Some store delis have pre-roasted whole chickens available for sale.

Fruit - Search the produce section for your favorite varieties of fruit.

Nuts - Peanuts are not period but almonds are a medieval staple.

Bakery Goods - Raid the bakery for a bag of cookies or small cake for your group

Since I have a piece of a page left, I will also leave with you another easy recipe for events. This needs a campfire or, better yet, a brazier for cooking on site.

Easy Kabobs

Beef Kabobs Ingredients

- Beef cubes
- Several large cubed onions
- Zucchini, Yellow Squash, etc.
- sliced green pepper (remove seeds)
- Marinade (Soy & Worcestershire Sauce, crushed garlic, pepper)

Chicken Kabobs Ingredients

- Boned, Cubed Chicken breasts (not so hard to do yourself.)
- Lemon Wedges
- Zucchini, Yellow Squash, etc.
- mushrooms
- Marinade (Lemon Juice, crushed garlic, salt, pepper)

1. Experiment with ingredients, the above are only suggestions. Try your own ideas.
2. Alternate ingredients on skewer. Begin and end with a firm veggie, meat falls off.
3. Place on Brazier or find a way to suspend or place vertical next to campfire
4. Cook until meat is done. Baste frequently with marinade. Rotate often.
5. Skewer it all at home, place in a plastic container in cooler, and cook on site.
