I would encourage all those interested in this position to start their preparations well in advance. The snow has marked the beginning of winter. SCA activity level typically drops during this season. Don't forget, however, that this is a great time to prepare new garb for next year. Also, you might use this season to consider trying a new craft or art. Leonardo da Vinci not only painted the Sistine Chapel's ceiling and carved some of the great statuary of the Renaissance but he also designed fortifications, weaponry, and other machinery. So try something new. Give cooking a try, or needlework. 

A Byzantine Cookbook . Chapter 12
"To Stew fillets of Beef"
By ML Demetrius if Condottierro

From: "A Delightful Dailey Exercise for Ladies and Gentlewomen" by John Murrell, 1621. Reprinted by Falconwood Press, 1990.

Original recipe: Take a rawe of beefe and cut it in thin slices half as broad as your hand and fry them until they bee halfe fried in a frying-panne with sweet butter vppon each side with a soaft fire, then powre them into a dish or a pipkin putting in a pint of claret-wine, a faggot of sweet herbs, and two or three whole blades of mace, a little salt, the meat of a lemon cut in slices, then stew these all together very softly for the space of two or three hours till it be half boiled away, then dish it upon sippits, and throw salt vpon it and serve it to the table hot.

My redaction:

The intent of this dish seems to be to brown beef then cook it very slowly in a wine sauce. This should make very tough meat quite tender. Note: the first time I cooked mine, I used bottom round and simmered for approximately 45 minutes. Trust the original recipe and cook it two hours unless you pound the meat to tenderize it first.


1/4 tsp mace 1 cup red wine*
1/8 tsp ground marjoram
1/4 tsp thyme 1 cup red wine*
1 lemon peeled
1 T butter
1 T olive oil

Combined in a bouquet garni bag: 1 clove, 2 tsp rosemary chopped, and 1 med. bay leaf.

Brown the meat in the oil and butter, add the remaining ingredients, make sure the wine covers the beef and simmer for two to three hours at a bare simmer. Remove the bouquet garni bag and serve.

*A light burgundy will allow more of the beef and other spices to come through. I used a heavy Bordeaux the first time and tasted primarily Bordeaux (not a bad Bordeaux though).



The "Kistory" of the Cantor Pauper By Lord Jovan Greyhawk

You may already know that Harry Simone wrote "The Little Drummer Boy" in 1958. But the story of the Latin version is known to but a few scholars in Vatavia.

Sometime during the Dark Ages (about ten or twenty years ago) the canticle "Cantor Pauper" was penned by a monk who called himself Henricus Ambrosius. Little is known about the friar except that he dwelt in Vatavia and was a member of the order of St. Humpk. Following this singular feat of scribery he vanishes into history. A number of undocumented versions lie scattered about my longhouse, but to the best of my knowledge only a singular version was published in the Dragonflyre (Dec. 1983, I think). Since then I have cleaned up the grammar a bit and rearranged some of the words. Other than this, it remains unchanged. Now, for only the second time, I humbly offer it to the good folk of Vatavia.

\$5 for members eating feast. \$1 for those not eating feast.


\$1 for children 12 and under eating feast. No site fee for children 12 and under who are
