See you at Yule Court.

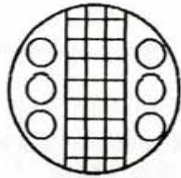
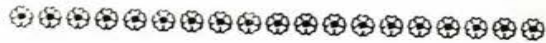

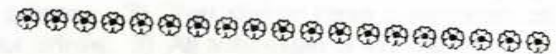

From the Caltrop, The Sequel

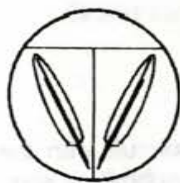
Unto the Populace of Vatavia come greetings from Lady Saerlaith nic Uilliam O'Ceallaigh, Caltrop Pursuivant.

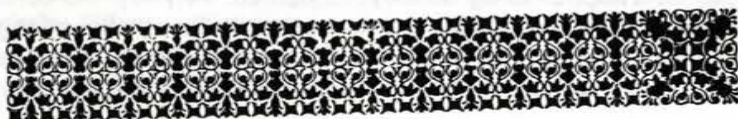

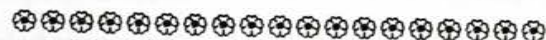

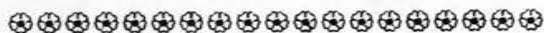

Portable Edibles

Valor XIII has floated into history. I promised several issues ago that I would print the recipe for the small pies in the Running Horse Tavern. My recipe is based upon the beef pie recipe supplied to me by Lord Leonardo il Calimaro and Lady Marie Chantal Delaire. Their recipe was adapted from the Culinary Arts Institute Cookbook (publisher information not available). I will give you Lady Marie and Lord Leonardo's version for completeness, followed by my redaction for both beef and turkey versions of this pie.

Beef Filling (Adapted from Culinary Arts Institute Cookbook)	Seasoned Beef (for Beef Filling)
1 large onion, halved and sliced	2 ½ lbs lean, cubed beef
2 Tbs margarine or shortening	3 carrots in 2 inch pieces
1 ¾ cups seasoned cooked cubed beef (see left side for seasoning procedure)	1 tomato, quartered and peeled
¾ cup cooked rice	2 yellow medium onions, quartered
2 Tbs bouillon or meat extract	1 stalk celery in 2 inch pieces
3 Tbs hot water	1 garlic clove, minced
1 Tbs chopped fresh parsley	1 tsp. salt
1 ½ eggs	1 tsp dried thyme
1 cup (heaping) shredded cheddar cheese	1 bay leaf
Salt & Pepper	2 sprigs parsley
	3 quarts (approx) water
Stir fry onions in margarine in a large skillet until golden. Stir in meat and rice.	Place all ingredients in an eight quart Dutch oven. Pour in water until ingredients are covered. Simmer covered 2-2½ hours, cool.
Dissolve the bouillon in hot water. Add egg and beat.	Stain stock through double layer of cheesecloth [or fine mesh strainer]. Catch stock in storage container for later use. Reserve meat for pie recipe.
Add meat mixture with parsley; salt and pepper to taste.	
Makes 2½ - 3 cups of filling.	

As you can see, the original recipe for the beef pies was rather complex. It does have the property of making a nice beef stock useful in other recipes or soups. The stock from this version became the base for a very nice onion soup. My recipes follow, and I think you will find them much simpler.

Beef Filling	Turkey Filling
2 lbs ground beef	2 lbs ground turkey
2 onions	4 tsp poultry seasoning
½ tsp garlic powder	2 cups broth cooked rice (see note)
2 cups cooked rice	4 eggs
2 sprigs parsley, minced finely	4 cups shredded mozzarella cheese
2 Tbs pepper	
4 eggs	
4 cups shredded cheddar cheese	
1. Brown the beef and drain.	1. Brown the turkey and drain.
2. Dice the onion and fry in margarine until golden brown.	2. Mix all ingredient together, place in open pie shells.
3. Mix all ingredient together, place in open pie shells.	3. Bake at 350°, 20-25 minutes until cooked through.
4. Bake at 350°, 20-25 minutes until cooked through.	
	Note: Broth cooked rice is simply rice cooked in chicken broth instead of water. Use canned liquid broth or add bouillon cubes to water when cooking rice.
Makes 8 cups filling.	Makes 8 cups of filling.

One thing to notice right away. Each filling recipe makes about 8 cups of filling. This is enough filling for maybe 3 or 4 full-sized pies. The pies freeze just fine and taste good cold and better hot. Pastry crusts will toughen a little when frozen or microwaved. You can lessen some of the toughening in the microwave by thawing the pies first, then reducing the heating time.

You can choose to purchase frozen pie shells or make them yourself. Be creative with other ingredients if you wish. Tell me of you successes!

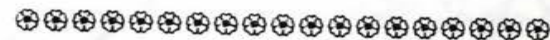
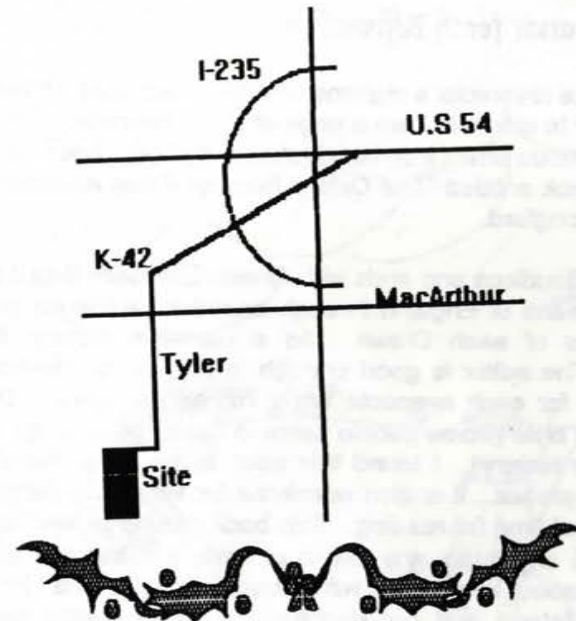

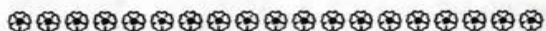

Book Review

Eek, my favorite chronicler's nightmare has just occurred. I finish the cut and paste only to discover I am a page short! Fortunately, I do not have any of my infamous artwork on hand (choke, guffaw). I do however have a wonderful book entitled "The Oxford Book of Royal Anecdotes" edited by Elizabeth Longford.

It begins with Boudicca and ends with Queen Elizabeth II as it traces the Kings and Queens of England through anecdotal evidence supplied by contemporaries of each Crown. As a narrative history, it is quite informative. The editor is good enough to tell the reader how reliable the resources for each anecdote are. The section on the Danes and Saxons is a bit brief (Some people seem to have better things to do than keep a written history). I found this book to be great reading for the average Anglophiliac. It is also wonderful for very busy people who do not have a lot of time for reading. This book can be picked up and read beginning with any reign, any length of time, and the reader does not have to worry about keeping up with a continuing plot line. Personally, I started with Victoria and her descendants, then I went back to the beginning. No continuity problems whatsoever. Definitely a great gift idea for someone's birthday or anniversary.



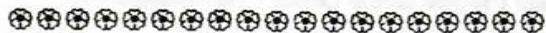
Editor's Note

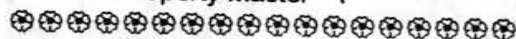

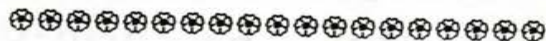
