



How to Make A Medieval Horologium

(Or Ode to a Sparrow Dropping from the Sku)

by Jovan Greyhawk

A horologium is a sundial. The Persona challenge in the Mews has gotten me to thinking about the whole business of telling time in the Middle Ages. What I propose to do is tell you how to make an eleventh century azimuthal sundial. This type of dial was in common use in England and Scandanavia. The beauty of this sundial is that NO mathematical knowledge is needed to construct it. If you're an armorer, you can make it out of brass or steel. A woodworker could use wood. A camper can lay it out on the field with stones. The model I'll be using is the sundial at Kirkdale Church in Yorkshire (A.D. 1064). It is based on the Anglo-Norse concept of dividing the day into tides.


First, you have to decide whether to lay out your sundial on a pedestal, garden style, or mount it on the wall of a building. The Kirkdale sundial was mounted on the south wall of the church, where it could catch the daylight sun. So I'll describe that method first. The first illustration you see (fig.1) is from an actual photograph of the sundial. To lay out the 'hour'

lines, draw a half circle and then divide it into halves and quarters (refer to fig.2). These are the tide markers. You can, if you like, divide the dial face into eighths. The gnomon or style is a simple rod which projects straight out from the center of the sundial, perpendicular to the dial face.

The Saxons made no attempt to adjust the gnomon to their latitude, AND YOU SHOULDN'T EITHER, You'll only make the shadow mark harder to read. The length of the gnomon should be about half the diameter of the dial face. You can lay out the principal tide lines at 45 degree angles with a protractor and compass, or you can just eyeball the whole thing. Extreme accuracy is not required. Mount your sundial on a south wall, where it can catch the daylight sun. Makes sure it's large enough for the neighbors to see. Your sundial is complete. If you want to mount your sundial on a garden tupe pedestal, you can lay out the dial face on a complete circle (see fig. 3)

To read the time you'll first notice that it runs 'backwards', that is counterclockwise with respect to the kitchen clock. The dial face should of course face due south. When the gnomon's shadow points due west, it's dawn (the sun is in the east). When the shadow points east, it's dusk. The hatch marks on the main hour lines indicate the midtidal points: Morning tide, nooning

tide, and evening tide (see fig.4). The Norse evening corresponds to our afternoon. The intermediate lines divide the tides. The double-cross mark is believed to indicate a special church service, probably Lauds or the morning mass.

The hour lines could also be used to mark the canonical hours, which I have indicated in Roman numerals (fig.5). There were Prime, tierce, sext, nones, and vespers. Matins was generally celebrated at sunrise, while compline was observed either after sunset or at midnight.

This ends the practical side of my article. The rest is devoted to a comparison of the modern and medieval concepts of time. But as that part runs for several pages, I won't include it here. A short bibliography follows.





From Long Ago

The Legend of Arthur by Ld. Thomas Bacon

It is through the legend of King Arthur that most people first become acquainted with the Middle Ages. Since he burst upon the literary scene in the 12th century, King Arthur has been the most popular and enduring figure in popular folklore, rivaled only by the heroes of Homer's epic poems. Even today new tellings of his story appear regularly.

The historical Arthur is hidden by mists of the past. In the few recourse that survived, there are only brief mentions of him by name, and one other passage that could be applied to him. That is all. All else is legend.

The fifth century was a perilous time in Britain. The Roman legions that had protected her had made their last appearance on the island in 418. Hope of their return remained until 446, but to no avail. Meanwhile, Vortigern, a native taking over from the Romans, had invited some Saxons from Germany to help him fight the Scots and Picts, who were coming down from the north. But the two Saxon leaders, Hengest and Horsa, turned on Vorgiger, and thus began the Saxon invasions, at a date usually recorded at 455.

The earliest account of what occurs next is given by the monk Gildas in about 540. While he wrote his treatise, 'De Excidio et Conquesta Britanniae,' mainly to deplore the wickedness of the current kings, he did give a brief account of the recent history.

In it he mentions that resistance to the Saxons was organized by Ambrosius Aurelianus, a Roman descendent, which ended victoriously with the battle of Mons Badonicus, or Badon Hill. Bede, who relied primarily on Gildas, dates the battle as 493 in his 'A History of the English Church and People'.

The next account of the period was written in 858 by the monk Mennius. In his "History of the Britons," he lists 12 battles that Arthur fought against the Saxons, with the final victory occurring at Mount Badon. The only other mentions of Arthur occur in the "Annales Cambriae," which puts the battle of Badon in 518 and notes that in the battle of Camlann in 539, Arthur and Medraut died. The mists of time reveal no more.


