




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
YULTIDE AMONG THE VIKINGS

Glad Jul! to all my fellow V'taevjar (that's Vatavians in the Norse tongue). I've been asked by Lady Diedre to tell of some of the Yule tide traditions among the Norse folk. Unfortunately the ancient traditions of my ancestors have proved to be as elusive as Bifrost, the rainbow bridge to Aesgard. For that you can thank men like Snorri Sturlseon. The scops and bards who wrote down the old Norse legends were pious Christians who wished to preserve their own history, but had no desire to preserve a heathen religion. Even if Norse religious ceremoy had survived, I doubt if you should have found much uniformity among the men who went a-viking.

Not only did the Vikings see fit to invade the homelands of decent Christian folk, but they even had the cheek to adopt local customs as their own.

Thus you find Normans learning to speak French, Russians adopting Orthodox Christianity, Danes becoming more English, Russians adopting Orthodox Christianity, Danes becoming more English than the Englishmen and Icelanders establishing the worlds oldest parliament, the Alping. So it is with religious custom. Consider how many Christmas Customs there are in America. Fortunately enough folk customs have come down from the North that scholars can trace back to the Old Religion. The Jultioen takes its name from the Yule Log, a specially prepared log burned on the shortest night of the year to coax the sun into returning to the North land. Fire was important to the Norse Folk, especially in the ancient times, when the secret of making fire was not easily come by. In every home the hearth was the center of religious ceremony where the names of gods and ancestors were invoked.

Many people think of Christmas trees as coming from the North. And it is true that, throughout Northern Europe, homes were decorated with greenery to remind folk that winter was half over and spring would be coming soom. 'Deck the halls with boughs of holly' runs the ancient carol. But the ancient Yule tree was never decorated. Its significance lay in the fact that it remained green and alive throughout the cold winter months. The modern Christmas tree comes from Germany, and is their version of the mediaeval Paradise Tree. The glass ornaments (originally nuts and berries) represented the fruits of the Tree of Life (in the Garden of Eden. The candles or lights stood for the angels and saints in heaven. And, of course the star was the Star of Bethlehem. The Paradise Tree is thought to have come from the Medieval mysteries and navitity plays.

Every Christmas Eve, American children await a visit from Santa Claus, the modern St. Nick. But the feast of Saint Nicholas never brought toys; he merely blessed the household and perhaps gave candy to the children. The spirit who comes down your chimney isn't St Nick but Thor himself; like all gods a master of disguise. Thor can be recognized by his silken robes of scarlet and green. He wears a great coat of fur, and his brown is wreathed with holly. His beard isn't white, it's cherry red. And of course he doesn't need a pipe to blow smoke rings out of his nostrils. Thor travels the land in a sleigh pulled by a team of reindeer or, where there's no snow, in wagon hauled by goats. To each house he brings gifts of food and mead. But when he blessed the household, he doesn't throw gold or candy, he rings a bell with his mighty hammer.

Indeed the fold of Scandia have need of Thor's blessing. For Ooinn also wanders abroad this night, riding his eight legged steed, Sleipner. In his presence, all souls are in mortal peril, for Ooinn seeks the ghosts of valiant men to join him in the battle of Ragnarok where Middle-Earth will be consumed in fire and ice. Ooinn is chief of the gods and when the king summons all must yield; his word is law. Only if men an gods fight bravely against the giants will the Alfaour deem us worthy of the Golen Agen to follow.

As I've mentioned before, many of the customs in Scandinavia were borrowed from other peoples, or from the Christians. In Sweden the feast of St. Lucia is celebrated in a unique fashion. The eldest daughter in the household dresses in white silks with a garland of candles in her hair. In this attire she serves breakfast in bed to her parents. St. Luica's festival occurs in mid-December.

As a subject of the Danelagh and a player of the puppets, I can't resist mentioning St. George and the Dragon. Everyone knows that George killed the dragon and became patron saint of England. But how many know that the legend of St. George is the subject of a Christmastide mysterie play? In a custom dating back to pagan times, men from each village would go from house to house acting out the story of saints and legendary heros. To insure good luck they disguised themselves. If their efforts were well received they were given gifts of food and drink. The ancient Romans called them Pantomimes or imitators of nature. In France they were called Mummers (from an Old French word meaning masquerade). In England they are known as Morris Dancers. In the play, St. George slays the dragon, but his most important roles is to be killed himself in the Sword Dance, thus symbolizing the death of Winter. He is then brought back to like by the Court Fool; a promise of the return of spring and the resurrection of Our Lord.

Prize tourney

Unto the populace of Calontir come greetings from HRM Iliya,

As many of you are already aware, I am sponsoring a prize tourney to be held at the Calontir Decennial celebration in the Shire of Mag Mor on the 12th of February.

I was for quite a time not a very active participant in the arts and sciences. For a number of years, I only dabbled in research and production of medieval objects and ideas, and then only when necessary (read garb). When I found something I was interested in, I had the good luck to live in a shire with a gentle who encouraged me to not only research that which interested me, medieval games, but also to produce boards and playing pieces. In doing so, Master Ulrich gave me the incentive to attack projects that at first seemed too long or complicated to be worth doing. Because of him, I not only researched production techniques such as woodworking and ivory and bone carving, but actually tried them! In addition, another gentle, Lord Brendan mac Ronan, showed me how to make joints, use veneers, and inlay decorative strips in wood. Although I probably would have eventually gotten around to making some games, their help allowed me to do so much faster. I have seen this type of encouragement and "sponsorship" help several other members of society get and stay involved in projects they might otherwise shy away from.

I wished, because of these experiences, to encourage and honor behavior similar to what these two gentles did for me. In addition, as a 'new-made artisan,' I began to get more involved in arts and science activities. One aspect of these is, of course, the 'arts and sciences competition.' I actually like competitions, even though I am not a very competitive person. Like a display, they gave me the opportunity to see up close what people were doing. In addition, they allowed an integral part of the society to get the public recognition I believe it deserves. However, they can be quite intimidating. I hope that this competition will be a low stress introduction to competition and allow us to celebrate the sponsorship which already exists in this fair kingdom.

There are several things about this competition which are different from the average Calontir competition. I have tried to give a complete explanation below of what the rules will be, but if you have questions, please do not hesitate to ask.

 Entrants shall not be members of the Orders of the Silver Hammer, the Calon Lily or the Laurel.

- All Entrants shall be sponsored by a Silver Hammer, a Calon Lily, or a Laurel. (Sponsors: you may sponsor as many as you wish, but please try not to sponsor so many that you cannot give adequate encouragement or help to all of them.)
- Entries will be basically judged by kingdom criteria, but the judges will be kind.
- 4. All work shall be completed by the Entrant. However, the Sponsor is encouraged to teach skills, help direct research efforts, offer advice or encouragement, etc. as needed or requested by the Entrant.
- 5. The Entrant does not have to do something in a field for which the Sponsor is known. Entries can be in any field. We will find judges.
- 6. There will be a time set aside for performing arts. Other entries will be on display during the day. (Group performances are allowed as long as there is only one entrant in the group. Please try do something all by yourself, though. It will make it much easier on the judges.)
- 7. Each Sponsor must bring at least one "prize" or token-preferably made by there own hand--for each entrant they are sponsoring.

Sponsors: The first prize that you give per entrant you sponsor is to be given to an entrant (not sponsored by you) who does not already have one. This will insure that every entrant will get a prize. Please feel free to make more than one prize per entrant if you would like to recognize the work of more than one of the entrants. Extra prizes can be given to whomever you please, even your own entrant.

- 8. Anybody, whether participating in the competition or not, can bring a token or tokens to give to the entrant(s) of their choice.
- Entries do not have to be completely finished by the time of the competition.
 However, if the project is not done, be prepared to explain what still needs
 to be done.
- 10. Sponsors will be responsible for preregistering their entrants. I do not care if you tell the entrant to take care of it, but I do not want anyone left out because no one knew who was responsible.

In addition to the sponsor's prizes there will be a populace's favorite and a judges' favorite awards given.

I would ask that entrants and sponsors make all possible efforts to be there the day of the competition. However, if one or the other of you cannot be there, please make arrangements for the entry and/or the prize to get to the competition.
