



Fighter practice is held Sundays at 1:00pm, at the west side of Watson Park. Everyone, fighters and non-fighters alike, are encouraged, to attend.


Sword & Shield/Pell practice is still being held at His Excellency Gabriel's house., as is armoring. Call 269-3854 for details.

## HOP TO BUILD A PERSONA

Welcome to the SCA! You've heard of us from friends--seen us at Renfair--driven past the park during Dance or Fighter practice. You've taken the biggest plunge of all, to step forward and say, "This looks like a lot of fun. How do I get involved?"

You've met a few people, maybe attended a populace meeting, and have great plans for the five yards of 100% blue cotton you picked up yesterday at Cloth World. You think that going to events this summer promises to be a lot more fun than roving the mall/steering your husband's Bassmaster/huffing glue fumes in your garage while you complete your fiftieth Ravel Porsche model. There's one niggling thing, though. a question that maybe every other SCA person has been asking since you first contacted these stick-whackin', skirt-wearin' individuals: "So, what's your persona going to be?" And you ask yourself the sixty-four ducat question, "*How do I make a persona?*"

As a former chatelaine, I would put this question near the top of the list of questions asked by new people. The idea of persona is one that's germaine to the Society. When Jeff puts on his tunic, clasps his belt, and sits down at the feast, he isn't Jeff who works at the local Quik-Trip: he's Wulfstan Eohricsson, Saxon warrior, member of a people renowned for their poetry and their metalwork. He behaves and dresses accordingly. interacting with a Venetian illuminator on his right and a Slavic leatherworker on his left. In jeans and T-shirts, to him they're just Jennifer and Brandon--but in garb, at an event, both he and they have stepped right out of the Middle Ages. This is the glamour, the magic of the SCA, and careful persona building will help a new person attain it.

Don't think you have to go beggar yourself at the bookstore and haul home several pounds of historical tomes, all with teensy print and pages of footnotes. That will get you right back into the Bassmaster. Instead, sit down a moment and remember just what it was that got you interested in the SCA in the first place. Maybe it was through historical romances, and you always wanted to wear a gown of red samite. Maybe it was through movies, and you always wanted to take the golden arrow prize in an archery contest. Maybe it was through martial arts, and you'd like to try a new fighting system. (I myself grew up listening to too much Wagner, and Brunhild the Valkyrie was my role model.) Your initial interests can serve as a star to steer by when the research gets too thick. The next step is to go to the library and look at the books that cover a wide range of medieval history. Time-Life Timelines or Ages of Man would

be one of my first choices. Pay attention to what grabs you! Then continue your quest in a spiral fashion, narrowing your fields of research until you have found the time-period and the people for whom you feel the greatest affinity.

Let's look at the fellow who always wanted to win the archery contest. He checks out some basic books, and focuses on anything mentioning archery or bows and arrows. His next batch of books may contain something about medieval England, because of the Robin Hood connection, and something about medieval warfare. From these he will find out that the Welsh bows could shoot through doors of oak, and that the English did so well overseas in their battles against the French because they had those same Welsh archers. Pretty nifty, he thinks. Those Welsh sound kind of cool. Maybe I'll be Welsh, if I can pronounce those names. On to Wales in the middle ages. To his dismay he learns that Wales was under the boot of Norman oppression since the twelfth century on. He also finds out that in 1212, King John hanged 28 young Welsh hostages from the walls of Nottingham Castle. He decides that his persona is going to be the brother of one of these youths, and, thoroughly outraged by the English voke, becomes a mercenary in the army of King Phillip of France.

Not every one in the SCA goes even that far with persona development. The young lady with a yen for red samite might go only so far as the costume books, and find out who had access to such material. Some people do research on their own background, and take the persona of someone who could have been their own ancestor. Others go way beyond what our would-be Welsh bowman accomplished, composing a family tree, memorizing one or two bardic pieces in the language appropriate for that individual, and making a concerted effort to wear only what would have been appropriate for such a person in his time period, place, and station. (Such dedication can be rather a hassel if it's time for the local Renaissance fair.)

Persona development is as idiosyncratic as each person in the SCA. There are only two rules I would announce, and those are: Don't Rush; Do Research. Take time to make sure you feel comfortable with your new identity--this is how an enormous amount of people, from your own local group, to your Kingdom, to the populace at Estrella, Lillies, or Pennsic, is going to know you. The reward will be worth the effort you've invested. For some, a persona is a patched robe to be donned hastily at need. For others, it is the key that unlocks their way to the Dream.

# THE FOUNDING AND EARLIEST DAYS OF VATAVIA'

In the days when rocks were soft and Charles Stewart O'Conner only had an AOA, out of the land of the Sun came a man to the Southern plains to a region newly created, known as Calontir.<sup>2</sup> His teachers predicted great things for him, and at the junction of two rivers he planted his standard, gained his fame, and met his destiny. His name was Humpk D'Bohunk from Bohemia.<sup>3</sup>

Humpk first appeared in the known world at the fall Crown Tourney in Atenveldt, AS XI.<sup>4</sup> He sojourned in the Barony of Atenveldt, learning the craft of fighting inder the tutelage of Master Ivan du Grae, Count Dennis of the Titans, and Duke Deaton Claymore. He became the lord of the household of Stormhaven, under the aegis of House Locksley. For his perseverance in waiting out the heat of the day for a small Night War, he was made companion to the Atenveldt Principality Order of the Wart, making him a Wart of the Court.

Around March of AS XII, Humpk traveled to the land that was to become V'tavia. With the encouragement of Bellphoebe, in the beginning of the new year of AS XIII, Humpk founded the Shire of V'tavia.<sup>5</sup> Named after the Bohemian river Voltava, its original settlers were Humpk, Bellphoebe, Maynard, and Nitram.<sup>6</sup> The were soon joined by Mammara Leona and Samurai Rick.

Humpk first showed his fighting prowess at Crown Tourney, held in the distant Barony of Three Rivers. Within two months, at the Tourney at the Center of the Knowne World, his fighting was so impressive that he was made a member of the fyrd.

In the fall of that year, the word was sent out for others to join the hardy band.<sup>7</sup> Among the newcomers were Keith, John Martin,<sup>8</sup> a canis

captaror, Kent Love and his lady Kathe, Royboy, and Cire Greymoor.<sup>9</sup> The winter was quietly spent in training, and in the first flush of April, V'tavia ventured out to the first Ansteorra-Middle Kingdom Border War. And it was there that Humpk received his Award of Arms.

Returning to V'tavia, they proceeded with the first Vatavian Championship Tourney, to decide who was going to represent V'tavia in the upcoming Calon Tourney that determined who would be the Champion of Calontir. It was held as part of V'tavia's first demo, in a strange place called the Kansas Coliseum, for and even stranger group called the Cband Truckers Association. Assistance came from Forgotten Sea in the form of Lord Ternon. Due to a recent accident, Lord Humpk was not fighting, and so fate appointed Royboy to become V'tavia's first champion.

Royboy was unable to fight at Calon Tourney II, and soon passed from V'tavia. While a healing back kept Lord Humpk out of the list, he nevertheless scored a string of victories in leatherworking before retiring from competition.

Fall brought the second V'tavian Championship Tourney, won by Cire. Summer had precipitated a decline in the population. All who remained were Lord Humpk, Mammara, Bellphoebe, Cire, and the summer's only newcomer, Aelfric. Despite such small numbers, V'tavia was to be the host of Calon Tourney III. And there on the shores of Lake Afton, God smiled on V'tavia. For while it rained all around the encampment of two hundred gentles, the site remained dry and was privileged to view a double rainbow. While Brummbar regained the Championship of Calontir, 130 authorizations were issued. A contest was held to find a song to praise Lord Humpk's beard.<sup>10</sup> Entertainment that night included seventeen Middle Eastern dancers, including Mammara's first performance at an event. Reveling last to the dawn, aided in part by the magic torches of steel chariots. And the population did double as House Battenhelm joined the hardy band. And thus the greatness of V'tavia began to show.

During the still time that is winter, Lord Humpk's back finished healing. And at Calon Tourney IV in Lonely Tower, he did renew his fighting fame, as he fought his way into the finals, only to be defeated by Chepe. Spring is the season for growth and renewal, and thus it so proved for V'tavia. By the end of spring, the population had grown to over twenty. By mid-summer it had passed thirty. By the end of fall, it had surpassed fifty.<sup>11</sup> Like a sign of divine approval, help in accommodating this influx came in the form of Mistress Hillary Stormrider from out of the southwest. And when the influx was settled, she left as quickly as she came.<sup>12</sup>

ASXV began with V'tavia becoming a part of the Kansas Newman College Renaissance Faire.<sup>13</sup> The following week was V'tavia's own ode to spring, the Tourney of Grace and Beauty, on the shores of Lake Afton. There marked the beginning of the short history of the Battenhelm Mobile Kitchen, and a very successful tavern.<sup>14</sup>

In July, V'tavia traveled to Lake Perry for their first glimpse of royalty. It was the Tournament of the Lily, but the blazing sun wilted the lily, and it became the Great Sweat. The unmitigating heat of the sun halted the tourney, all movement ceased, and Rannock's marzipan castle melted. As the evening cooled things down, court was held. Lord Humpk was made a huscarl, and Mammara and Cire were awarded Awards of Arms. V'tavia was presented a rose for their courtesy, honor, grace, and mobile kitchen.

Fall was ushered in with the first V'tavian Tournament of Valor, returning yet again to Lake Afton. There Lord Brummbar defeated His Lordship Humpk to take home the Sword of Valor. While victory was not in the cards that day, bigger things were in store for His Lordship.

Calon Tourney V, Three Rivers. Anticipating the day's outcome, V'tavia was the first on the site. Anxiously they waited as His Lordship, in his new leather scaled armor, slew foe after foe. And with the fall of William of Bellwood, His Lordship Humpk became the new Champion of Calontir. A week later, Lord Cire fought for and retained the Championship of V'tavia. His Lordship Humpk, anticipating a future change in his status<sup>15</sup>, resigned the seneschalate, appointing Christian MacBruce as his successor.<sup>16</sup>

While winter howled, a feast was planned. It was announced as just a Twelfth Night feast, but in secret, it was to honor His Lordship for his victory at Calon Tourney. While not all of the invited guests showed because of a storm moving through the area that weekend, that was their

misfortune. In the brisk month of February, V'tavia held the Festival of the Snow Queen. Though the prize tourney was held outside, the icy wind was too much for most spectators, who chose instead to watch the proceedings from the other side of a glass wall.<sup>17</sup> In the bridge melee that followed, some new equipment made its first appearance: water wings. Designed to keep a fighter from drowning, their effectiveness was questionable.

Two weeks later, the message arrived that V'tavia had become a barony.<sup>18</sup> While the formal investiture was to be several months away. royal permission was given for His Lordship Humpk and Lady Mammara to assume the titles of Baron and Baroness. And on April 5, 1981 the first baronial court was held.<sup>19</sup>So V'tavia's star rose even higher and shone that much brighter.

## THE FACTS

1. This has been adapted from Volume One of the Vatavian History. I have kept the original names and spellings of the time. It was around the time of Calontir becoming a Kingdom that heralds ruled that the use of the apostrophe was not period practice and was replaced by the 'a.' The reason for the apostrophe is one of the mysteries of history.

2. For the details of the founding of Calontir, see the histories written by Master Baron Crag Duggan.

3. This account tends to concentrate on Humpk's activities because for much of the period, Humpk was Vatavia. It was not until after Vatavia became a barony that other personalities became noticeable and began to influence events. Humpk's name also evolved because of the heralds. Starting with Humpk D'Bohunk, it went to Humpk D'Bohun, then to William of Vatavia when he decided it was no longer worth the fight.


4. The date of Humpk's first SCA event was 10/2/76.

5. The exact dates of the meetings which sketched the beginnings of Vatavia were not remembered by the participants more caught up in the moment of creation, and ironically not considering history. The branch application is dated 5/15/78. So I arbitrarily set the founding date as May 1 to coincide with the Society New Year. Humpk, the only founder still active when I did this, never objected.

6. Bellphoebe was a local lady who had met Humpk when he had previously lived in Wichita. She was also involved with the SF community. Maynard was another person who first got involved in the SCA in Atenveldt. Nitram was Humpk's brother.

7. This was the first of the Free University Classes that were regularly held for the next several years and were a major source of newcomers. They ceased with the collapse of the Free University.

8. Though he soon dropped out, many years later he rejoined the Barony. He took the society name John Bromere.



Another person who had a run-in with the heralds, he added Edward as a first name to satisfy them.

#### 10.

Imagine the classical picture of an Old Testament Patriarch and you will have a good image of Humpk's appearance. At least two songs were written, although I only have the words for one.

#### 11.

With this increase of population, V'tavia now had the population base to be a barony. The application for the change of status is dated 7/14/80.

#### 12.

The actual circumstance of Mistress Hillary's appearance is a subject into which I did not delve. She was Humpk's previous wife. By then Humpk had already met Mammara Leone and were married in the fall. Mistress Hillary had already left by the time I began attending local functions, so I know nothing of the dynamics of the situation and did not feel it was my place to inquire. All I know of her is that she was described as having a formidable personality.

#### 13.

The RenFaire at this time was still nothing more than an extension of several classes. Thus it was mostly a collection of dramatic and musical performers and some local vendors. Very laidback.

#### 14.

The presence of a tavern at most Vatavian events can be traced back to the Mobile Kitchen. While the Mobile Kitchen itself did not last the summer, it reappeared a number of years later informally as the Vulgar Unicorn, which became the Guzzling Gargoyle, which became the Bloody Axe Inn, the Running Horse Inn, and various other names.

#### 15.

Humpk gave up the office in anticipation of becoming Baron. Yet while it was easy to give up the title, it was not so easy to give up the power. There were a number of reasons for this, and was a continuous source of tension throughout the Humpk and Mammara tenure on the Baronial thrones.

#### 16.

Also that fall the structure of the Vatavian award system was formed. It was patterned after the regional awards and replaced a set of ad hoc awards that were poorly documented. The Act of Dedication award subsumed a number of these awards. This has caused some confusion in the OP regarding these early awards.

#### 17.

This event took place at Kiwanis Recreation center. At the time the south facing wall was plate glass. Since then, the glass has been replaced by sheet metal because of vandalism.

#### 18.

The decision to allow Vatavia to become a barony was made on 3/8/81 by the BOD.

19.

The investiture of Humpk and Mammara as Baron and Baroness occurred at the Second Ansteorra-Middle Kingdom War held outside of Tulsa on 6/31/81. Vatavia dominated the court by not only the investiture, but also by receiving thirteen AOAs. On a side note: also at the war, on the other side, attending one of his first events, was the future Seneschal and Baron of Vatavia, Tedrick von Wolfschatten.

The various autocrats reported on their respective events. Crown plans were finalized, some details are being finished. Available crash space and volunteers for troll are needed. Contact Penelope. The post revel is planned to be held at Kasamira's tower. The Champions' event will be held in conjunction with the Birthday Bash this year. The tentative date is July 12th. Various possible feast plans and menu suggestions and alternatives for this event were examined. Valor work continues. The paperwork and certificates needed for Valor were discussed. Guild heads and interest groups should make requests and wish lists in writing to the Baronage for consideration. Funds are available to be made use of. Vatavia will again sponsor the publication of the Kingdom :Laws. The Property Mistress has received donation of metal signs. She and some volunteers will be repainting these for the group's use. The embroidery project for the water bottle covers continues. The storage location of some of the Baronial property was clarified.


The Chronicler thanked the officers for their letters for publication. Changes based on requests and suggestions from the populace are being made. There are no new demonstration requests at this time. This is normal for the time of year. There has been no heraldic activity at the Kingdom level since February. There were no Calontir items on the May Laurel Letter of Acceptances and Returns. It was recommended that the various interest groups sponsor a project night. Various possibilities were suggested. Planning will start this July.

Fighter practice continues at Watson Park on Sundays. Last week the practice went to Westumbria. Otoshi encouraged the officers and populace to attend and join in the comradery. It is also a chance to meet

others and perhaps find that ride you need or someone to make that tunic - maybe in exchange for a ride. Archery continues to meet at 5500 North Maize Road. There has been a request to use one of our archery nets at the Lilies event. Details for this were worked out.

The officers were reminded of the changes in this month's calendar made due to Lilies. Populace next month will be on July 16th at Linwood Park; Officers' meeting will be July 7th. People were reminded to get award recommendations in before Crown. Period lighting for the regalia was addressed. There will be a war levy called on Saturday at Lilies. Our part for this will be organized at populace. Camping plans for Vatavia during Lilies were mentioned and briefly reviewed. Completion of the RenFaire heraldry was also discussed.


