





Lord Stephen O'Bannon

hen ye one and all typically encounter Lord Stephen O'Bannon on the archery field or sitting across from ye at a bardic fire, most of ye dost marvel at me clever Irish wit and casual dedication to archery. There is however much that is hidden or unknown to thee.

A long time ago, I was born to me elated young parents John and Jennine O'Bannon in the year of our lord 1353 on the twenty-first day of May. This blessed event took place on the banks of the beauteous

River Shannon at Cluain Mhic Nois, and esteemed placed of higher learning managed by the church.
