





atavia has had a long tradition of heraldic excellence within Calontir, the latest example being the selection of Lady Alyx de Vernon of Briarwood as Saker Herald. The primary job of the Saker Herald is to organize heraldic submissions, both name and device, from Calontir and then send them to other heralds within the known world to confirm and register. Because Saker is now in Vatavia, our Cherbi and Cherbin have expressed a hope that Vatavian heraldic submissions will increase. However, despite the traditions of Vatavia, many practical aspects of heraldry within the Society remain obscure.

Registering names and devices can be broken down into two basic parts, doing and waiting. Doing means choosing and researching a name and designing a device. Included in this is filling out the application forms for Society registration. These are the activities that happen at a heraldic consultation table at an event.

Names are, in many ways, the more difficult aspect of registration. Any registered name must have been "common" in our period. Basically, what this means is that there has to be some credible example of the name's usage up to 1600. There are several ways this can be done. Obviously, famous historical figures can provide examples, such as Charles and Pepin from the Frankish Carolingian Dynasty. However, most names aren't based on an obvious personage, and this is where the research comes in. At a heraldic consultation table, there are many large books, each of which is accepted as documentation of period names. These are not the only available sources, however, so if you find a name in a credible history book, these can be used as well. Remember, though, that the books that many heralds have include solely names and all are acceptable for our purposes. Over 90% of acceptable names will be included in the materials that Lady Alyx takes to a consulting table.

Choosing a device is often easier. Most people know what colors they like, they usually have an idea what things they might want shown on their device, and nearly all have seen enough coats of arms to have a general idea of how they are supposed to look. To design a device, one doesn't need to know what azure is, they only need to know they like blue. Pale or bend?

Who cares, do you want a diagonal dividing line or a horizontal? Virtually any item that is period can be added, and virtually any animal, including nearly any monster or fantastic animal can be added. There are a few exceptions, but don't worry about the official, specific details of heraldry. That's the herald's job and if you do choose something that is restricted, they'll tell you.

There are a couple of basic things to keep in mind when designing a device, and both are easy to remember. The whole point of a device, is to identify a person in nearly any situation, including that of a battlefield. Thus, a device needs to be distinctive. So first, try and fill up each individual area. In other words, if you have divided you shield with a bend (a diagonal line) and are putting a dragonfly in each side of the bend, expand the dragonflies as large as you can. If you are putting something in an area several times, display them in such a way to occupy as much space as you can. For example, three dragonflies on a shield should form a downward pointing triangle. For four and five, look at how the pips are arranged on dice and so on. That's the moderately obscure part of designing.

The other part is widely known. Don't put a metal on a metal or a color on a color. There are two metals: gold (or yellow) and silver (or white); and five colors: red, blue, green, black, and purple. Thus, we have basically seven colors, and you might notice that six of the seven are part of an 8 color Crayola box. The other is white. Realize how distinctive these colors are and look at what the metals are compared to the colors. The metals are light, the colors are dark. The metal and color rule is simply a codification of the basic fact that yellow shows up on black and not on white, and red does the opposite.

Although helpful to know, the heraldic details are not your job; they're the herald's. They will tell you what the blazon, the heraldic description of your device, would be. All you need to do is to go to the herald with an idea of what you want. The heralds might make suggestions such as a more period style of arrangement or change of a restricted item, but they have to have something to work with.

Once all of the research and designing is done, and the forms have been completed, the waiting begins. Saker Herald receives the forms and makes sure that all of the important details have been taken care of. Those forms then get passed along to various other heralds at both kingdom and Society level. These other heralds examine the names and devices submitted and

confirm that they are historically accurate, then they determine there is conflict with a device or name someone has already registered.

This process is extensive, exhaustive, tedious, and long. Usually, you can expect a device or name registration to take four to six months, if everything goes well. Unfortunately, if there is a conflict on one or the other, then some changes will have to be made. One portion on the submission form allows for minor changes, within certain restrictions such as language, to be made by the heralds. This can allow the process to continue. Otherwise, the submission will be returned so that you can make whatever changes are necessary. At this point, the procedure begins again, however if you resubmit within a year, you will not have to pay the submittal fee again.

Heraldry, as practiced in the Society, is both a bright colorful art form and a very precise science. These procedures, though cumbersome, allow Society heralds to keep the spirit of heraldry alive.

His Lordship Friar Thomas Bacon

f asked to name a weapon from the Middle Ages or the Renaissance, the first to come to mind for most people is the sword. And the sword was certainly the premier weapon of the time. If asked for the most influential weapon of this period, you might get answers like the longbow or the pike. It will only with some thought that some will realize that the correct answer is the gun. For with the coming of the gun the structures that formed the Middle Ages literally crumbled.

Even when people remember that guns were part of the period the SCA studies, they usually associated them with the last century. Yet the story of guns begins in the middle of the High Middle Ages. There is uncertain evidence that firearms were first used in Europe by the Mongols in 1241. In 1267 Roger Bacon wrote down the recipe for gunpowder. The first depiction of a cannon is found in a manuscript done in 1326. By the 1340's and increasing number of towns could boast of possessing cannon. By 1400 they were a military necessity.

Necessary, but not necessarily effective. Early cannon were built like barrels, held together by hoops and forge welding, and so were relatively weak. Gunpowder was also of questionable and variable quality. As a result, cannons were often as much a danger to the cannoneers as to the enemy. Ponderous weapons, they were difficult to move, and once setup almost impossible to re-aim. Easy to avoid in the field, they were relegated to siege work.

Throughout the 15th century, these and other defects were dealt with. By the end of the century, while there were refinements still to be made, the basic form and organization of firearms could be seen. Ordinances were promulgated, detailing the specifications of firearms and their provisions. The bow and pole-arm were still the principal infantry weapons, but their days were already numbered.

Like the crossbow before it, the gun had its supporters and detractors, and for much the same reasons. It did not require much training to learn how to use it, or remain proficient with it. It could kill at a distance even though armor. It was still possible to make armor bullet resistant, but by 1600 with the continuous improvement of small arms, such armor was so heavy to be unwearable. Bullet dents can be found on a large number of late period armor. These are usually the result of proof tests and not battle damage. Its

main disadvantage was it's slow rate of fire.

Since the early makers of gunpowder came from the ranks of the alchemists, guns became associated with magic. And as it threatened the existing hierarchy, many considered it the work of the devil. The noise, smoke and smell of expended gunpowder added to this notion. And like the crossbow, none of this slowed people down from using it.

While knocking down high castle walls was spectacular, this was not the reason why guns had such a profound impact. It was relatively easy to adapt the walls to take cannon fire. It was in the economics of owning cannon. Acquiring and supporting a siege train of cannon was expansive, and increasingly necessary to take or defend a fortress. By the beginning of the sixteenth century, only kings could afford this expense, and the lesser nobles could not stand up to them. The kings could afford this because they could exploit sources of revenue unavailable to the lower nobility. This freedom from the lower nobility effectively collapsed the feudal order and allowed the rise of the nation-states.

Note I said "allowed" and not "caused". For guns are just part of the tapestry that denotes the end of the Middle Ages. The increase in trade which gave rise to the middle class, the increasing willingness of the intellectuals to look at things in new ways, the inability of the old order to deal with the natural catastrophes of the later Middle Ages all added to the impetus that created the Modern Age. It is to the gun that we own the speed of this transition. For against the gun the old order had no defense, no way of slowing down the changes it had wrought. Only feudal Japan held out, and only by banning guns all together, and collapsed utterly when those with guns returned to stay.

Those not martially inclined were reminded that the Costuming Seminar would be held in Forgotten Sea on February 6th. Gathering of the Clans will be in El Dorado February 20th. Some details were covered. Their Excellencies described the site, which includes showers. Property needs for this event will need to be looked at and planned.

Vatavia's BUSH session is scheduled for April 10th. Part of the classes presented are geared toward Ren Faire. A survey will be distributed this month to the populace and other participating groups and individuals. It is requested that these be returned by February 17th. The next meeting of the Steerage Committee is scheduled for February 23rd. It is open to all interested individuals.


